#YouSaidWeDid -

Beat priorities focus on the issues that matter most within our communities.

These priorities are shaped by you, and they give us the opportunity to address the concerns that affect your daily life.

You Said- Youth related Anti-social behaviour (ASB) in Spittal Park, Castle Donington, was becoming an issue.

We Will- Work with the Parish council to investigate any ASB or offending at the location and take appropriate action against those responsible.

You Said -There has been an increase in ASB in the Wheatcroft Lane area, Castle Donington.

We Will - Continue to tackle the ASB by working alongside partner agencies, including housing agencies to identify those responsible and to take appropriate action to alleviate the issues.

You Said- Vehicle related anti-social behaviour on Diseworth Road, Castle Donington continues to cause a nuisance.

We Will- Continue to hold multi-agency meetings with partners and members of the public to maintain transparency and clarity around the Police's position and actions completed to reduce the ASB.

Increase in Motorbike Thefts-

Over the previous months we have seen an increase in Motorbike thefts across the whole of North-West Leicestershire. Some of these bikes have not been secured effectively with minimal security measures implemented.

Motorbike thieves can steal a bike in seconds. Help protect yours by taking a few simple precautions:

- ◆ Always use your steering lock and remove the keys.
- ◆ Use a quality disc lock and a heavy-duty chain secured to a fixed object.
- ◆ Cover your bike to make it less attractive to thieves.
- ◆ Park in well-lit, busy areas or secure parking where possible.
- ◆ Consider fitting a tracker and an approved alarm or immobiliser.

If you see suspicious activity around motorcycles, report it to the police. If a theft is happening, call 999 immediately. For non-emergencies or to report information, use 101 or your local police's online reporting service. These layered security measures can significantly reduce the risk of theft.

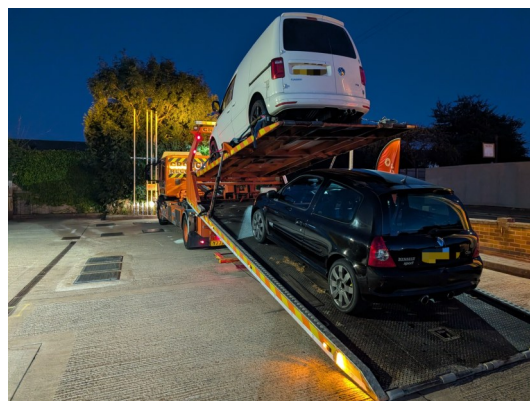


Section 59– Updated.

A significant change has been made to Section 59 of the Police Reform Act 2002, giving police greater powers to deal swiftly with vehicles used in an antisocial manner. Section 59 has traditionally allowed police officers to seize vehicles when they are being driven carelessly, inconsiderately, or off-road in a way that causes, or is likely to cause, alarm, distress, or annoyance to members of the public.

The Government's Crime and Policing Bill has removed the requirement for police to provide a prior warning before seizing a vehicle under Section 59. The intention is to enable officers to take immediate enforcement action against vehicles being used antisocially, particularly in relation to nuisance motorcycles, off-road bikes, e-scooters and other vehicles

These enhanced powers reflect the growing concern around the antisocial use of vehicles and provide police with a stronger tool to protect communities from behaviour that undermines public safety and quality of life.
