| Priority 1:- ASB Youths causing ASB predominately in Groby. | The Beat Team completed patrols at the hotspot areas and identified 2 offenders whom were dealt with accordingly. In addition we have organised some school visits to engage with the youths and prevent further issues. |
| Priority 2:- Road safety Numerous reports of overweight vehicles and speeding motorists within the villages. | Multiple vehicles have been seized this month for No Tax, No insurance, Driving without a correct licence. A section 59 was also issued to a driver who was causing distress to horse riders. |
| Priority 3:- Rural crime including burglary will always be a priority for the area of NH29 beat. | Patrols around the more rural areas have been conducted especially on the late shift covering up to the Warwickshire border after reports of hare coursing have been received. Rise in reports of burglaries this month as well as theft from motor vehicles. Targeted proactive patrols have been completed in response to this particularly in the latter parts of the day and night. |

We have had a busy month. We have seen a rise in burglaries and attempted burglaries to outbuildings in the area. Please take extra care to secure your home

Ewe herd it here first... we received a call of 100 loose sheep in Markfield, accidents wool happen but all's wool that ends wool. The sheep took the path of fleece resistance and after a speedy headcount all were returned safely to their field.



Local Officers visited a member of the public after they contacted us to hand in a sword and firearms. This responsible owner did not want them getting into the wrong hands. If you're worried about a firearm being used irresponsibly or dangerously, not stored in a safe and secure way or about the behaviour of a certificate holder, **call** 101.





Over the coming weeks we will see celebrations for Halloween, Diwali and Bonfire Night and unfortunately at this time of the year there are Individuals who use this occasion as an excuse to cause trouble for residents. It is essential to remember the importance of celebrating safely and respecting

those who choose to not take part.

Remember....

- You must be 18 or over to purchase fireworks.
- For Halloween only visit properties with displays/ pumpkins etc.
- There is a Midnight curfew for fireworks during Bonfire Night.
- There is a 1am curfew for fireworks during Diwali.
- Be kind to your neighbours especially with pets and choose to attend an organised display.
- Allow children to carry torches or glow sticks to allow drivers to see them.
- Finally, have fun, be respectful and stay safe.

Property discovered at the side of the road in Market Bosworth has been traced back to a victim of Burglary that had occurred over night. The victim was extremely grateful after the property was returned. An investigation continues.

A vehicle was issued with a section 59 notice which is a warning after being identified as causing distress to riders on horseback. A reminder to all road users, care must be taken when passing horses. The British Horse society's "Dead Slow" messaging is now incorporated into the Highway Code . This notice will stay on the Police National Computer system for a period of 12 months and further reports could result in vehicle seizure.


