Door-to-door sales scammers are visiting households across East Midlands.

We have received several recent reports of rogue door to door salesmen who sell cleaning goods but then vastly overcharge. They are particularly targeting elderly and vulnerable people – if you have any older family members, friends or neighbours please check in with them to make them aware of the scam. If you are approached to pay by card, please do not. Our advice is do not open the door to or engage with anyone trying to sell goods, or to anyone you don't know or are not expecting. There is a cross-county operation targeting the activities of these criminals to bring them to justice and prevent future victims. "In the meantime, we're asking you to share this message far and wide, and if you see any suspicious activity to please report it to us."

Recent incidents have been reported in Derbyshire and Nottinghamshire, however we may also have victims in Leicestershire, but there may have been unreported cases across the county.

Doorstep fraud checklist: what to look for -

Fraudsters can be very believable, using urgency, emotion and good old-fashioned charm to persuade you to do something. But these might be the very clues you need that something isn't right. Here are some signs someone is trying to defraud you in person. What to do if you suspect fraud -

If you've seen something that doesn't feel right, STOP!

- break the contact – say no thanks and close the door
- don't hand over any money or personal information – you should never pay for goods you haven't received or work that hasn't been completed
- never let a cold caller pressure you into a quick decision – any legitimate trader will be happy to return later
- Check if its genuine: ask trusted friends and neighbours if they know the company, or enquire with Trading Standards.

What to do if you've already responded to the cold caller

Don't panic! What you do next depends on whether you've shared information or made a payment.

A sticky fingered individual was active around Gumley Square, Enderby after entering a number of vehicles in the location. Opportunist thieves aren't necessarily looking for specific loot. Your mobile phone, coins for the car park, sunglasses, packs of medication or other items that can earn quick cash are irresistible to the opportunist thief. Remember, the cost of replacing a window is often much more than that of what's stolen. It should go without saying that wallets, handbags, purses and credit cards should never be left in an unattended vehicle. Fuelling up or popping back into your house to get something are perfect examples of how easy it is to turn your back for a moment and forget your vehicle is unsecured, so get into the habit of locking your vehicle even if you're only going to be away from it for a moment.

If your vehicle has wing mirrors that fold in automatically when locked, make sure you lock it properly. Criminal gangs are looking for vehicles like these where the wing mirrors are still out because it is clear to them that the vehicle has been left unlocked.



Attended an incident whereby suspicious persons in balaclavas were sighted in the area of Meridian Business Park on CCTV. We attended and searched the area, however no trace. There was also no reported damage or break ins to the business premises in the area following these people being spotted. We followed this with a patrol of the local Premier Inn carpark which backed onto this area to ensure that those suspicious persons were not looking to break into work vans that were in the neighbouring car park.

Your Fosse Park Team were very busy during one shift and secured charges for 4 Thefts and a Fail to Stop which came to a total amount of nearly £5500! The suspect was arrested in joint working with our colleagues from South Leicester Police. If you choose to commit theft and other offences at Fosse Park you can expect a knock at the door from one of our teams

After numerous reports of an e-scooter and quad bike being used anti-socially in the vicinity of Tay Road, Lubbethorpe ourselves and Blaby District Council have sent a joint 'advice' letter to the perpetrators. This is the first stage in the incremental scale. Should this continue we will increase this to the next stage.
