What matters to you

- Anti Social Behaviour —You have told us that Anti-Social behaviour causes you concern. This can be things like excessive noise, parties, smoking drugs and more. We will be working with partners to ensure we can tackle these issues and prevent them occurring again.
- Motor vehicle crime—You told us that you were concerned about vehicle crime. This can be theft of motor vehicles or theft from motor vehicles, this also includes theft of tools from vans and theft of catalytic convertors.
- Road Safety—You have told us that Road Safety is a priority, this includes things like Speeding, Insurance,
 MOT and driving offences.

ASB Patrols:

After reports of ASB around the Hobby Close area and the Buxton Crescent estate, your local beat team have completed patrols in the area and around the village to locate and deter youths from committing ASB.

The issues are being looked into and some have been identified. They will be spoken to in due course. If you have any issues regarding ASB you can report this via our website.



Stolen Vehicles Located:

Thanks to some very eagle eyed Broughton residents, 2 stolen vehicles have been identified and seized due to reports of them being left suspiciously.

- A stolen Blue Jeep Cherokee was found on The Fieldway in Broughton Astley on the 9th of October. It was stolen from Melton on the 4th of October.
- Another stolen vehicle, a White Audi S6 was found on Primethorpe Walk in Broughton Astley on the 10th of October. This was stolen from the New Parks area in Leicester on the 8th of October.

Seized Quadbike:

After reports of issues around the Broughton Astley and Lutterworth areas of youths causing issues in a quadbike, the local beat team along with the Lutterworth team have located and seized a quadbike suspected of being used in an anti-social manner under Section 59 of the Police Reform Act.

Darker Nights Campaign:

- Residential burglaries can be deeply upsetting. It can be traumatic to lose valuable and sentimental items from your home and the thought of a stranger invading your property is distressing.
- Protect your home against opportunist burglars by remembering to lock up and light up.
- These darker evenings can provide the perfect cover for burglars who can easily spot an insecure window or door, or valuable left in plain sight.
- Check out our other advice on how to keep your property safe: Keep burglars out of your property | Leicestershire Police (leics.police.uk)
- Install strong fences and gates and make sure that they are always locked. Consider adding trellis and spiky plants to the fences to make it difficult for burglars to climb over them.
- Consider installing external CCTV cameras or video doorbells. Always lock your windows and doors when you are in and out.
- Try to make your house look as occupied as possible when you are not there. Use automatic timer switches to turn lamps on and off sporadically.
- Do not leave your house and vehicle keys in the lock or on a side table in view of a window or next to a door. If you wish to obtain a faraday pouch you can visit a police station and ask for a car key pouch.
- Check your UPVC or Euro Cylinder door locks to see if they're snap resistant. It should be stamped with a three-star kite mark. For more information on this please visit the Leicestershire Police Website.
- To not leave items in open porches that could be used to enter your home such as curved-handled umbrellas. These items could be used as "fishing" implements to use through a letter box or open window.
- If you're going away, cancel newspapers and milk. You could also ask a trusted neighbour or friend to keep an eye on your property and take your post inside.
- Use external sensor lights on your driveway / rear garden.
- A Think about increasing the visibility of the entrances and exits of your home. Consider cutting back and removing large plants and bushes that restrict visibility from the road.
