You said - We did

- Speeding (10 votes on Neighbourhood Link (NHL)). Between 01/03/2026 and 31/03/2026 the mobile speed camera visited Lubbenham Hill once. In total twenty four offences were detected.
- Anti social behaviour (10 votes on NHL) - identifying individuals causing the anti social behaviour. Passing their names to the council to start the incremental approach. Targeting areas of known ASB activity.
- Drug dealing (11 votes on NHL) - We have been conducting plain clothes patrols in areas we are told drug dealing is an issue. We collect intelligence from residents and CrimeStoppers and apply for magistrates warrants and conduct drugs raids on those we suspect of dealing in drugs. We encourage anyone to report drug dealing to us anonymously through CrimeStoppers.



This month, we welcomed a new police commander. Inspector Chris Day has taken over as the commander of Market Harborough and Wigston Neighbourhood Policing Area (NPA). Inspector Day has 22 years' policing experience and says he is looking forward to meeting colleagues, residents and partners and learning what matters most to the community. John Richardson, Chief Executive of Harborough District Council welcomed Insp Day and said; "We now look forward to working with Chris and welcoming him into our strong partnership arrangements, which continue to support our communities and keep them safe." With the longer days and weather getting better, a timely reminder about ebikes and escooters.

- It is illegal to ride a privately owned e scooter in public spaces, including pavements/footpaths, roads, parks, and other public areas.
- Privately owned e scooters may only be used on private land with the landowner's permission.
- If you are caught riding a privately owned e scooter in public, it may be seized by police.

An e bike is treated the same as a normal pedal cycle only if it:

- Has pedals that can propel it
- Has a motor with a maximum continuous rated power of 250 watts and the motor assistance cuts out at 15.5mph (25km/h). The rider must be aged 14 or over. E bikes that do not meet these rules (including some modified/higher powered bikes) are treated as motor vehicles rather than an EAPC.
- If someone is riding dangerously and there is an immediate risk to the public, call 999. Otherwise report via 101 or online.
