What matters to you:

Priority 1: You told us that you were concerned about burglaries within the Oadby area.

What we are doing: Officers continue to conduct regular patrols of the areas where offences have occurred, these patrols are reducing the number of burglaries. We will continue to do this going forward. Where CCTV is available, this will provide valuable intelligence on times and when offences are happening and possible vehicles involved, to assist in our patrol strategy.

Priority 2: Road Safety You said: You have told us that Road Safety is a priority, this includes things like Speeding, Insurance, MOT and driving offences.

What we are doing: We have conducted vehicle speed checks at identified locations. Local officers have been targeting motorist's speeding, not wearing seatbelts, using mobile phones and drink/drug driving. Local officers have received reports of identified vehicles being driven without valid insurance, MOT and tax.

Priority 3: Anti-social Behaviour You Said: You have told us that Anti-Social behaviour causes you concern. This can be things like excessive noise, smoking drugs and more. We will be working with partners to ensure we can tackle these issues and reduce their occurrences.

What we are doing: Your local police beat team and response officers continue to patrol identified locations, as reported by yourselves with regards to anti-social behaviour and drug related incidents. Officers continue to stop check persons and vehicles who are involved in drugs. Local officers have identified vehicles which are related to criminality.

What we have done #YouSaidWeDid

Some of the key activities from over May includes:

Anti-Social Vehicle Use

As part of our neighbourhood policing priorities, the Oadby Police Team continues to identify and tackle the use of vehicles in an anti-social manner. Officers have conducted patrols in identified hotspot locations, and where appropriate, Section 59 warnings have been issued to drivers whose behaviour has caused alarm, distress, or annoyance to members of the public.

Drug Misuse

Throughout the month, the Oadby Police Team identified a number of individuals involved in drug misuse. Appropriate enforcement action was taken against those involved, helping to address community concerns and reduce the impact of drug-related activity within the area.

Neighbourhood Disputes

Local police officers and PCSOs have continued to work on several ongoing and complex neighbour harassment cases. Community Resolutions have been issued where appropriate, and in one particularly serious case, further enforcement action, including the consideration of arrests, is being explored.

Neighbour disputes can be challenging and often require significant officer time to investigate and resolve. We encourage residents to report concerns at an early stage so that support and intervention can be provided where necessary.

Serious Road Traffic Collisions

During August, local PCSOs supported response officers at two significant road traffic collisions. Officers assisted at the scenes by helping to manage traffic, support emergency response efforts, and ensure the safety of all those involved.

Reports of Weapons

Response officers attended reports of two individuals believed to be in possession of weapons at an address in Oadby. Thanks to the swift response and prompt attendance of officers, the situation was quickly brought under control, preventing any violence from occurring.

Events

Oadby Motor Fest

On Sunday 9th August, PCSO Nad represented the Oadby Team at the Oadby Motor Fest. The event provided an opportunity to engage with residents, families, and visitors from across the community. It was also a great to meet with Assistant Chief Constable Jonny Starbuck of Northamptonshire Police, who was attending the event in a personal capacity. ACC Starbuck previously served as Chief Superintendent with Leicestershire Police. A sincere thank you goes to Sam and the team at Epic Accessories for organising such a successful and vibrant event. We look forward to supporting the event again next year.





Visit to St Paul's Church Coffee Pot Morning

On Thursday 13th August 2026, PCSO Nad attended St Paul's Church Coffee Pot Morning as part of a community drop-in session. The event provided a positive opportunity to speak with local residents about a range of crime prevention topics. A recurring concern raised during conversations was the increasing resident scams and fraud, an issue which continues to affect many people within our communities.

PCSO Nad will be returning to St Paul's Church for a follow-up session, where practical advice and guidance will be provided to help residents recognise scams and protect themselves from becoming victims.



Saddington Car Boot Sale Patrols

Throughout August, local PCSOs and police officers conducted patrols at the Saddington Car Boot Sale. Although located outside the Oadby area, the event attracts visitors from communities across Leicester City and County.

While car boot sales are legitimate venues for buying and selling unwanted goods, they can occasionally attract individuals seeking to dispose of stolen property. By attending these events, officers can gather valuable intelligence, identify suspicious activity, and disrupt those who may be attempting to profit from crime.

Officers provided reassurance to traders, buyers, and visitors while carrying out patrols focused on identifying property linked to theft, burglary, or other acquisitive crime.
