#YouSaid - What matters to you

NEW PRIORTIES

You said that the following three priorities matter to you. Due to this, we have taken proportionate steps to target harden, educate and tackle the following priorities.

Priority 1) Anti Social Behaviour regarding off road bikes – Melrose estate, Greenhill estate, Barden hill, Ellistown

Priority 2) Targeted patrols on Anti Social Behaviour, focusing on Greenhill skate park, Waterworks rd and Cropston drive

Priority 3) Road Safety – Parking & Speeding.

#WeDid - What we have done

You said - off road motorbikes are causing anti-social behaviour (ASB)

We Did - A number of high visibility patrols were conducted in the area at key times were a number of Ecins reports were generated. We also managed to identify a number of suspects through captured CCTV images and local intelligence. Three advice letters have been issued, four section 59 notices issued to suspects and one off road bike seized. A number of meetings have been held with joint agencies. With one of these being North West Leicestershire council, were added fencing and gates are to be fitted on Springfield football pitch, Melrose estate. Joint visits with the council are also in the diary to visit suspects.

You said - Youths are causing issues around Greenhill

We Did - Multiple high visibility patrols and house to house enquiries have been completed throughout the quarter. We have seen a substantial reduction in targeted Anti-social behaviour. This is to be maintained and more focused driven on locations that are more susceptible to anti social behaviour throughout the summer months.

You Said - Vehicles speeding in residential areas and parking particularly outside Schools are a problem.

We Did - A number of patrols were conducted at drop off and pick up times regarding schools in the area. Several parents were spoken to regarding there parking, and a number of educational posts were uploaded to social media. Speeding op's have been completed on Grange road, Hugglescote, and Loughborough road, Thringston, with two TOR's issued for traffic offences and four words of advice given to drivers. Five cars have been seized due to no road tax or valid MOT.
