What matters to you

You told us these 3 issues are most important to you:

1. Drug Dealing

What we're doing: This month Charnwood Borough Council and your local beat team were successful in obtaining a closure order on an address in Burns Road, Loughborough. This order prevents anyone including the occupants from entering the property for a period of 3 months. We would like to thank residents for continuing to assist us in gathering sufficient intelligence in relation to drug activity to be put before the courts.

2. Shoplifting

What we're doing: This month the beat team have continued to engage with stores encouraging incident reporting, so that we can then secure evidence and deal with those identified responsible. We have also conducted a number of beat surgeries in the vicinity of stores utilising the advertisement van warning against shoplifting.

3. Road Safety and Speeding

What we're doing: This month, further speed checks have been conducted along Shepshed Road, Hathern with data showing on one of those occasions that 22 out of 100 vehicles were seen to be driving above the prescribed 30 mph speed limit. This data shows a clear need for further road safety and enforcement activity in this location.

Community Engagement

The team conduct regular beat surgeries at various venues across the beat area to engage with the community, address concerns, and provide support.
