What matters to you

We have revised our beat priorities as of April 2026 to reflect what we have been told concerns the community most.

- **Priority 1: Anti-Social Behaviour—Granville Road**

What we did: We have been in contact with various departments in the council to come to a long term sustainable solution to the ongoing concerns of vehicle related ASB—in the meantime, we will be continuing with enforcement work with our colleagues from our Traffic team.

- **Priority 2: Theft and Shoplifting**

What we did: Sainsburys, Queens Road have reported a drop of between 60-80% in thefts—mostly from bulk thefts. PCs Gray and Rodgers will be continuing with their close work with the stores on the beat to ensure a safer working and shopping environment.

Priority 3: Violence and Night Time economy harm.

What we Did: Dedicated operations have been carried out in May to respond to any issues or concerns for safety during later evenings when pubs and restaurants are busier. We will be continuing with sporadic patrols and operations for the foreseeable.

Other Local News

- **Burglaries**—Despite not being a primary priority, we are still responding effectively to burglaries. Clarendon has seen 3 Burglaries over May to-date, Suspects have been identified and further investigations and enquiries are taking place.
- **Bike Thefts**—We have been having a small upsurge in bike thefts at places of learning during the warmer months — Bike Register is one of many options available to secure and deter would-be thieves, we highly recommend a solid D-Lock.
- **EID**— May's EID festivities passed by with minimal issues, we would like to thank the staff and stewards at the grounds for their vigilance when our presence was requested during the event.
