What matters to you:

Priority 1: You told us that you were concerned about burglaries within the Oadby area.

What we are doing: Officers continue to conduct regular patrols of the areas where offences have occurred, these patrols are reducing the number of burglaries. We will continue to do this going forward. Where CCTV is available, this will provide valuable intelligence on times and when offences are happening and possible vehicles involved, to assist in our patrol strategy.

Priority 2: Road Safety You said: You have told us that Road Safety is a priority, this includes things like Speeding, Insurance, MOT and driving offences.

What we are doing: We have conducted vehicle speed checks at identified locations. Local officers have been targeting motorist's speeding, not wearing seatbelts, using mobile phones and drink/drug driving. Local officers have received reports of identified vehicles being driven without valid insurance, MOT and tax.

Priority 3: Anti-social Behaviour You Said: You have told us that Anti-Social behaviour causes you concern. This can be things like excessive noise, smoking drugs and more. We will be working with partners to ensure we can tackle these issues and reduce their occurrences.

What we are doing: Your local police beat team and response officers continue to patrol identified locations, as reported by yourselves with regards to anti-social behaviour and drug related incidents. Officers continue to stop check persons and vehicles who are involved in drugs. Local officers have identified vehicles which are related to criminality.

What we have done #yousaidwedid

Some of the key activities during March includes:

- Local officers continue to carry out patrols across the Oadby area. Where opportunities arise, residents are being offered advice and guidance on practical steps they can take to better protect their homes.
- Our neighbourhood policing teams are maintaining regular patrols in areas identified as having drug-related concerns and anti-social behaviour. Through proactive policing and valuable information shared by the community, several individuals involved in these activities have been identified and appropriate enforcement action taken.
- Two individuals were stopped and searched during patrols, leading to the discovery of Class A and Class B drugs. Both individuals were dealt with for drug offences, helping to disrupt local drug activity and protect our neighbourhood from associated harm.
- An illegal e-bike being ridden recklessly was seized, preventing further risk to pedestrians, road users, and the rider themselves. Illegal and unsafe use of e-bike continues to be a concern, and we will keep taking action where necessary.
- PCSO Harks and PC Ryan attended an ongoing neighbour dispute involving a land-boundary disagreement. They spent time with both parties to understand the concerns, offer practical advice, and help reduce tensions. This work remains under review to ensure the situation does not escalate and that all parties feel supported.
- While out on day shift patrols, PC Harks and PC Ryan identified a stolen vehicle in the Wigston area. The vehicle was seized and recovered. We are now carrying out further enquiries with the owner and exploring evidential opportunities.
- At a Oadby car meet, local officers witnessed a vehicle being driven recklessly. The vehicle initially attempted to make off but was located and the driver dealt with. When the meet dispersed into other parts of the county, officers continued to monitor hotspots across the wider neighbourhood area and conducted two stop searches, locating a small amount of cannabis.



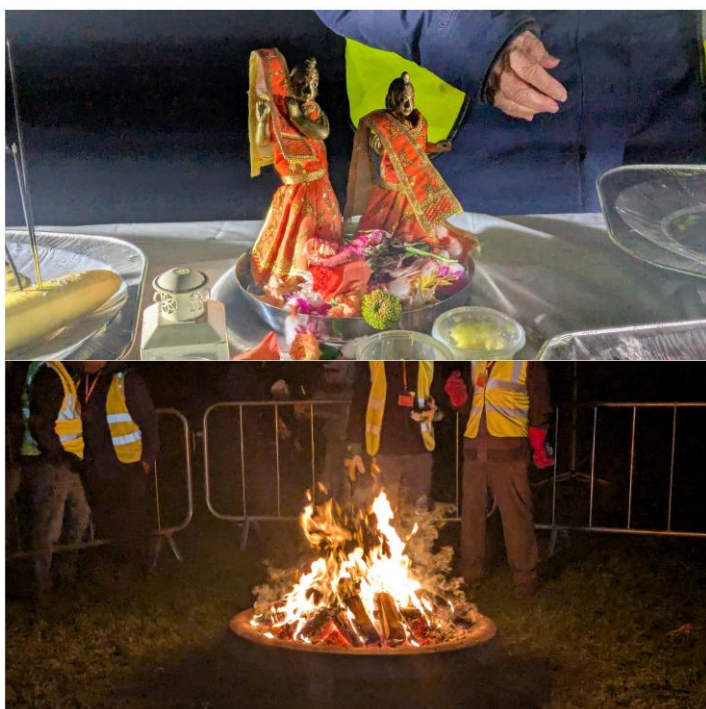
Meet Your Police Session at St Paul's Church, Oadby
