What matters to you

From data collated from local surveys, beat knowledge, intelligence and reports made to Leicestershire Police, the following have been highlighted as priorities within the community.

Priority 1: Drugs.

You said: Drug use and supply is ongoing in the Saffron Lane Estate and in other areas of the community.

We did: An individual was recently arrested after being found to be in possession of Class A drugs in the Aylestone Road area. They were initially reported to have been behaving suspiciously and after being located/searched they were arrested, a later search of the persons property found that there were more drugs and other related items inside. Enquiries are ongoing to determine how this person came to be possession of the drugs and their intentions with them.

Priority 2: Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) in open spaces.

You said: ASB in open spaces is still occurring in parks, play areas and other areas.

We did: Patrols in open spaces have been conducted and we are pleased to report that again there have been no major or repeat issues, patrols are set to continue over the Summer when we do usually see an increase in reports of ASB. Issues at the Kingfisher Youth Centre have also decreased after a group of youths were spoken to after being identified by local CCTV footage.

Priority 3: Vehicle Misuse/Safety.

You said: There has been an increase in the use of E-Scooters and vehicle being found unsafe.

We did: Patrols have taken place in the Windley Road/Meadow Gardens area after recent reports of vehicles driving dangerously and off road bikes being ridden in the open space area.

Other Local News

This month marks the return of Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) Awareness Week, a national campaign aimed at reducing and tackling repeat reports of ASB in local communities by working with partner agencies and being visible and proactive in hotspot areas for ASB.

As part of the week local PCSO's Spencer and Kayleigh held a joint engagement with Tim & Amber from the Leicester City Councils ASB team at the Aylestone Leisure Centre with the aim of giving local residents a chance to speak to multiple agencies about issues relating to ASB both residential and locally.



The event was positive and gave the team the opportunity to discuss issues with our partners all with the aim of making the beat a nicer and safer place to live and work.

The team will also be out conducting visible patrols of hotspot locations for ASB and working with local schools and businesses during the week to reduce and prevent issues.
