#YouSaidWeDid - What matters to you

Priority 1: Anti-social Behaviour in and around Braunstone Park, Cort Crescent and Gallards Hill

You said: Anti-Social Behaviour in and around Braunstone Park continues as a priority concern from the community. Over the spring period, the team will continue to concentrate on this location.

We Did: Anti-social Behaviour in and around Braunstone Park continues to be a priority concern raised by the community. Throughout March, the beat team has conducted multiple high-visibility patrols in and around the park to provide reassurance, deter offending, and engage with local residents.

As part of Op GIZMO, officers also carried out several knife sweeps across key areas of the beat. During these patrols, the team recovered an abandoned knife, which has now been safely removed from the area. In addition, officers located a stolen bicycle, which was successfully returned to its rightful owner after a positive response to a social media appeal.

The team will continue to focus policing activity in and around Braunstone Park to address community concerns and reduce ASB.

Priority 2: Road Safety

You Said: From Community Surveys and Feedback on Neighbourhood Link, road safety has been highlighted to be a local concern. We will continue to concentrate on speeding concerns and anti social behaviour caused by e bikes, e scooters and off road motorbikes.

We Did: From recent Community Surveys and feedback received through Neighbourhood Link, road safety continues to be highlighted as a key local concern. Throughout March, the beat team has focused on tackling speeding issues and ASB linked to e-bikes, e-scooters and off-road motorbikes.

As part of this work, officers conducted several Op Pedalfast deployments, resulting in the seizure of 10 illegal e-bikes and 2 illegal e-scooters. The team removed multiple illegal vehicles from the ward's roads, including vehicles being driven without the appropriate licence and others found to have no insurance.

The beat team will continue to prioritise these concerns and take proactive action to improve road safety and reduce vehicle-related anti-social behaviour within the community.

Priority 3: Anti-social Behaviour (Drug related)

You Said: From the Surveys on Neighbourhood Link you have told us that drug dealing and usage at locations across the Braunstone and Rowley Fields area is a concern.

We Did: Throughout March, officers have proactively targeted vehicles and individuals linked to drug supply within the ward. As a result of this work, the team has seized four vehicles connected to suspected drug supply, disrupting criminal activity and reducing associated harm within the community.

The team also continues to gather intelligence regarding potential cannabis grows in the area.

We encourage the community to continue reporting any suspicious activity, unusual smells, blacked-out properties, or increased comings and goings. Every piece of information helps us build a clearer picture and take effective action.

It's been a productive and positive period across the beat, with officers and PCSOs working hard to keep our community safe. Here are some of the fantastic results from the team:

Knife Crime Operation – OP Gizmo

This week saw the entire beat team out in force as part of OP Gizmo, our ongoing work to tackle knife crime. Officers carried out knife sweeps, targeted patrols, and community engagement, helping to reassure residents and keep our streets safer.

Stolen Motorbike Recovered

PCSOs Julie and Beth were quick off the mark on Folville Rise, locating and recovering a stolen motorbike. A great example of proactive policing and attention to detail.

Cloned Vehicle Seized

The pair continued their excellent work when they identified and recovered a cloned vehicle on Mortimer Place. Their vigilance prevented further offences and helped protect innocent vehicle owners.

Traffic Powers Put to Good Use

With their newly acquired Traffic Powers, PCSOs Julie and Beth also seized a vehicle being driven by someone holding only a provisional licence — another unsafe vehicle removed from the roads.

Two Wanted Offenders Detained

The team also spotted two individuals who were outstanding for multiple offences. Working alongside neighbouring beats, both suspects were safely detained and have now been put before the courts.

Partnership Working

PC Chelsea has been working closely with Leicester City Council on a number of cases across the ward, strengthening our partnership approach to community safety
