## What matters to you

We have listened to you and the concerns you raise

Our beat priorities continue to be:

**Priority 1: ASB. What we are going to do:** The beat team aim to tackle incidences of ASB within the villages including the parks and beauty spots of Charnwood West utilising ASB and civil legislation and patrols in locations identified as subject to ASB.

**Priority 2: Speeding and Road safety. What we are going to do:** The beat team will deal with issues of road safety and speeding in Charnwood West villages. If you believe that there is an issue in your area, let the beat team know.

**Priority 3: Drugs. What we are going to do:** The beat team will deal with incidences of drug use and dealing across the beat area. Patrolling identified areas, utilising stop search powers where available and develop intelligence to allow us to target dealing within your area.

The Charnwood West Dedicated Neighbourhood Team have been working throughout September to tackle our chosen priorities of Speeding and Road Traffic Safety, Anti Social Behaviour and Drugs (including use and drug dealing).

All the team featuring Sergeant Adkin, PC Nicholson, PCSO Martin and PCSO Colley have been working both out on the beat engaging with the community, and completing essential behind the scenes administrative work on the below and other aspects of policing:

## Speeding and Road Traffic Safety

Unfortunately, the planned speed operations for November did not go ahead due to officer absences and sickness. This month has also been particularly busy for the Charnwood NPA, with significant commitments including Remembrance parades, the Loughborough Fair, and responding to high-risk missing person cases. As a result, officers were abstracted from normal duties. Despite these challenges, the beat team has maintained a visible presence in marked police vehicles across other reported hotspots where possible, helping to deter speeding and reassure residents. We remain committed to keeping our roads safe and welcome continued feedback from the community.

## Anti-Social Behaviour

Throughout November, the beat team has continued to focus on tackling anti-social behaviour across our villages. We attended a joint agency meeting with Great Central Railway in response to ongoing ASB at Ploughlands in Quorn. In Rothley, we conducted a voluntary interview with an individual reported for crime and ASB-related incidents and carried out a joint agency visit with Charnwood Borough Council at another address in Greenway Rothley. CCTV enquiries were completed with local businesses following youth-related ASB reports, and we visited local schools to engage with young people. We are also pleased to report a successful eviction at an address in Rothley, achieved through joint intervention between the beat team and local housing providers in a prolonged investigation into many reported crimes and ASB. Alongside these actions, we have continued to patrol all of our villages and ASB hotspots reported to us, and we have visited victims of ASB to provide support and reassurance. The beat team remains committed to working with partners and the community to reduce ASB and keep our area safe.

## Drugs and Drug Dealing

During November, the Charnwood West Beat Team has continued proactive, high-visibility patrols in areas linked to drug use and supply, focusing on Quorn, Rothley, Swithland, and Woodhouse Eaves. Officers have gathered and submitted intelligence to develop on individuals and locations suspected of involvement, which is now being developed to support ongoing investigations. We are working closely with the Neighbourhood Priority Team to address properties and hotspots connected to drug-related activity, reinforcing our commitment to keeping the community safe and reducing harm. This month a local male in Swithland will receive a conditional caution for his involvement in a small cannabis grow, and a local juvenile has been charged with possession with intent to supply cannabis in Quorn.
