# You said - We did

- Speeding (10 votes on Neighbourhood Link (NHL)). Between 01/10/2025 and 31/10/2025 local neighbourhood officers visited various sights across the area to undertake speeding enforcment.
- Anti social behaviour (10 votes on NHL) identifying individuals causing the anti social behaviour. Passing their names to the council to start the incremental approach. Targeting areas of known ASB activity.
- Drug dealing (11 votes on NHL) We have been conducting plain clothes patrols in areas we
  are told drug dealing is an issue. We collect intelligence from residents and CrimeStoppers
  and apply for magistrates warrants and conduct drugs raids on those we suspect of dealing
  in drugs. We encourage anyone to report drug dealing to us anonymously through
  CrimeStoppers.

Deputy Chief Constable Michaela Kerr attended the Police Public Bravery Awards 2025 with Nathan Selby of Market Harborough, who saved a one-year-old child from drowning. Mr Selby was walking through Welland Park with his family just before Christmas 2024, when his daughter saw something in the river that looked like a teddy bear. He heard a woman shouting that she was looking for her one-year-old daughter in a yellow coat. He realised the little girl was floating downstream. He immediately jumped into the water, grabbed her and carried her to safety where she received life-saving resuscitation from an off-duty doctor. Mr Selby snapped a ligament in his leg when he jumped into the water. The little girl was taken to hospital and has since made a full recovery. Mr Selby was presented with a silver award at the ceremony in recognition of his heroic actions. He said; "I was so surprised when I found out I had been put forward for a national bravery award. What happened was a complete accident and, as a parent myself, I can't think of anything worse. I'd do it again. Just knowing she is ok makes my life a brighter place and I hope she goes on to do wonderful things."
