This initiative was wellreceived, providing opportunities for meaningful conversations with local businesses and residents. The Evington and Coleman Ward team remains committed to maintaining a safe and supportive environment for all community members.



The below new and updated beat priorities have been set to take effect from July.

What Matters to you?

Evington Ward

- OPERATION GROOVE A targeted policing operation to prevent any increase in ASB or crime in and around surrounding open spaces
- A series of educational pieces to highlight the importance of road safety, followed by a series of road safety operations to ensure road safety is maintained across the area.
- Patrol the location of Downing Drive and surrounding areas in a bid to drive down ASB, crime and provide reassurance to the community.
- Provide targeted patrols in the area of Harwin Road and surrounding area to protect the vulnerable and ensure confidence from members of the community surrounding ASB and drugs use.

Coleman Ward

- Patrols and licence checks with local licenced premises to prevent ASB and crime.

- A series of educational pieces to highlight the importance of road safety, followed by a series of road safety operations to ensure road safety is maintained across the area.

What we are doing



PCSO COOK has been actively addressing various issues in her local beat area.
