You Said	We did
General ASB could be targeted harassment or general nuisance behaviour. Whether that be youths loitering/congregating and causing distress to the local community, or minor low level neighbour disputes which involve in behaviour that requires intervention by the appropriate agencies such as Police, Housing Associations and/or Blaby District Council.	Officers have been working on a particular ongoing neighbour dispute in Sapcote on Moores Close which has led to offences being committed. Along with progressing these cases, it's been a busy couple of weeks for the beat team while they engage with Blaby District Council and the housing officers. Subsequently despite the issues continuing the right proceedings have been put in place against those involved in terms of the issuing of a Community Protection Warning.
It has been reported to Leicestershire Police that the community are growing concerned around individuals presenting themselves in suspicious circumstances which subsequently involve drug dealing or the intake and misuse of illegal substances.	Hot spots have been regularly patrolled and members of the community who are regularly in touch with the beat team have supplied the beat team with significant intelligence and CCTV which helps us develop a broader picture in dealing with this issue.
Road safety and speeding through the villages has been identified as an issue for the NH24 Fosse Villages Beat.	Please see below.

News

Officers have been out on patrol at the Croft Car Boot Sale as part of Op Generator. We spent the day engaging with members of the public, stall holders and event organisers, explaining that we were there to offer reassurance, provide crime prevention advice and help identify any suspected stolen goods. It was a hot and sunny day, with lots of positive engagement from visitors and vendors. A big thank you to everyone whom took the time to speak with us and support the operation.



The beat team have launched a Speeding Operation across two beats on the Blaby District, the Fosse Villages and the Braunstone and Thorpe Astley Beat, after the recent road traffic collisions that occurred in Elmesthorpe. Those that are aware of this will have seen the extent of the damage and impact it had on the community, seeing such vehicles conduct such poor driving behaviour, leading to terrible RTC's. The driver of one vehicle had sustained quite serious injuries and after spending a substantial amount of time in hospital, shortly after, paid a visit to police custody after being arrested for dangerous driving and possession of Class A drugs with the intent to supply. After a search of the vehicle, it was found that the rear of the vehicle had numerous boxes of Class A drugs.

We have been covering Croft, Sapcote, Elmesthorpe, Braunstone & Thorpe Astley, and you may have seen us on your travels. This is off the back of the recent update of the beats priorities. These being 'road safety and speeding' across these areas. You may have seen quite a visible presence in these areas, and whilst some may argue that we should, or should not be "hiding in bushes", it's important to be visible when conducting these operations to not only proactively deal with speeding vehicles in the village but to also act as a deterrent. With the equipment of the SL700 Speed Monitoring Gun we managed to monitor over 100 vehicles across the villages, and confirm that we have stopped and dealt with accordingly, around 50 speeding vehicles in these villages. A top class result we'd say for the concerned residents of the communities across these areas.
