What matters to you

We have listened to you and the concerns you raised and will priorities the following from March 2025.

Priority 1: ASB. You said: You have concerns around antisocial behavior across the village. We will continue to try and disrupt this type of behavior and use the ASB incremental approach to deter offenders.

Priority 2: Speeding. You said: You are concerned about vehicles speeding in the villages. We will continue to monitor and enforce speed across several sites in the village.

Priority 3: Burglaries. We aim to work with the relevant authorities to reduce the burglaries across the village and to try and reduce the number of reported thefts from the recycling centre. Visiting victims and offering crime prevention advice.

Priority 1: The beat team aim to tackle different elements of ASB in Mountsorrel

We are pleased to report a noticeable reduction in ASB incidents across our area compared to previous months. This Improvement follows targeted action after incidents in October and the Partner Agency working. The work has included community engagement and youth support initiatives. This has contributed to a safer and more welcoming environment. Please continue to report any concerns via 101 or online so we can maintain this progress.

Priority 2: The beat team aim to target reports of speeding in Mountsorrel.

Speed Ops

Recent speed checks on Leicester Road show that most drivers are complying with the 30 mph limit, with only a small number significantly exceeding it. Four vehicles were recorded at 20mph, while 25 were travelling between 21mph and 25mph. Seventeen vehicles were recorded between 26mph and 30mph, eight were between 31mph and 35mph, and just one vehicle was detected travelling between 36mph and 40mph. No vehicles were recorded above 40mph. These results indicate that while the majority of drivers are close to the limit/below the limit. We will continue monitoring and enforcing speed limits to keep our roads safe.

Priority 3: Burglaries

With darker evenings and the festive season, burglary risk often increases. To help prevent this, high-visibility patrols in the village continue. These patrols aim to deter offenders and reassure the community. Please continue to take precautions by keeping doors and windows locked, using timers for lights, and avoiding sharing holiday plans or expensive purchases on social media.
