Three Main Priorities

The three main priorities your neighbourhood team are currently focusing on as well as other on-going matters are:

YOU SAID-

Persons riding e-scooters committing traffic offences and causing Anti Social Behaviour

WE DID

Increased marked and unmarked patrols including a dedicated operation resulting in warnings issued, scooters seized and education given around legislation

YOU SAID-

Drug use and Anti Social behaviour

WE DID-

Partnership working with Leicester City Council resulting in properties being secured reducing drug use and ASB in the locality

YOU SAID-

Drug dealers using the Abbey Rise to supply class A drugs...

WE DID-

A number of recent warrants have been completed on the beat which has resulted in a number of arrests and enquiries continue into these offences

These issues are some of the many issues raised by you via our Neighbourhood Link surveys and by direct engagement whilst out on our foot patrols and at our beat surgeries. If you see us out and about please do come over and have a chat.

Neighbourhood Link is a free online messaging service between Police and the community allowing us to keep you updated and aware of any emerging issues.

These priorities are reviewed regularly and changed as required.
