PC 993 Makda and PCSO Meerun were out on patrol along Ambassador Road when they spotted a vehicle being driven in a concerning manner. A quick stop check revealed the driver only had a provisional licence and wasn't following the rules for learner drivers of no supervision, no L plates and not insured properly. A Traffic Offence Report (TOR) was issued and the vehicle recovered. If you're a learner driver, here's what you NEED to know:

- You MUST be supervised by someone aged 21+ with a full UK licence held for 3+ years
- You MUST display L plates clearly front & back of the vehicle
- You MUST have the correct learner driver insurance
- No motorway driving unless with a DVSA-approved instructor in a dual-control car

Breaking these rules isn't just illegal – it's dangerous, stay smart, stay safe, and drive respon-

It was a busy shift for PC Darbar and PC Taylor, their day started with an emergency call to an attempted burglary. Thankfully, nothing was stolen, an investigation is now underway to catch the suspect. Later, they were out on high-visibility patrols around Rockingham Close and Beatty Avenue - engaging with the community and conducting enquiries. To finish off the day, they joined an area search for a wanted male. With help from fellow officers and the amazing dog unit, the suspect was located and arrested.





A 30-year-old man has been charged with nine offences following an appeal relating to a burglary in Rowlatts Hill, Leicester. On Tuesday 22nd April an appeal was issued to identify a man after a house was broken into. On Sunday 11th May, Kamalpreet Singh, of no fixed address, was charged with four counts of burglary dwelling with intent to steal, three counts of fraud, one count of intentional harassment, alarm or distress and one count of possession with intent to supply class A drugs. The burglary offences occurred between Wednesday 9th April and Wednesday 7th May. The fraud offences relate to the use of bank cards stolen in the burglaries. The charge of harassment relates to an incident occurring on Thursday 1st May. The drug offence relates to the discovery of class A drugs on Friday 9th May. Singh was remanded to appear at Leicester Magistrates' Court on Monday 12th May.
