

What matters to you

#YOU SAID, WE DID

You said: Anti-social behaviour was a priority.

Reports of anti-social behaviour during Halloween has been kept to a minimum. Proactive patrols of key hotspots were completed throughout the night with minimal issues reported. Few reports were received of behaviour causing harassment alarm and distress, these continue to be investigated by the Beat team and our response colleagues and perpetrators will be dealt with accordingly.

You said: Road safety continues to be an issue

There has been an increase in reports of vehicles causing obstruction and/or nuisance across the area. Vehicle owners are reminded that if they are parking their vehicles, particularly in a residential area. It is NOT blocking a public footpath, blocking any driveways, parked on double yellows or restricting access to emergency service vehicles.

You said: Rural Crime is priority.

We have had some good work reported this week from officers who attended a report of Hare coursing in the Desford area. The report was received and attended by our local response officers who seized a thermal scope as well as two dogs under special legislation relating to hare coursing. The investigation is being managed by the Rural Crime team.

What we are doing

We have listened to you and the concerns you raised and will prioritise the following in October 2023.

Priority 1: Road Safety

You said: That Road Safety issues are your number 1 concern.

What we are going to do: Work with partnership agencies such as Market Bosworth Fire Service to tackle Road safety issues.

Priority 2: Antisocial Behaviour (ASB)

You Said: Anti-Social Behaviour including use of motorbikes on open spaces was an issue to you.

What we are going to do: Patrol key hotspot areas for anti-social behaviour and continue to gather intelligence to take action against those who are persistent offenders.

Leicestershire Police has carried out 43 warrants, arrested 38 people and made safeguarding visits to more than 20 vulnerable people during a national week of action targeting drug dealing and supply.

Officers also recovered cash, drugs and weapons as a result of the warrants carried out across Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland during County Lines Intensification Week from Monday 9 October to Sunday 15 October 2023. The intensification week is designed to disrupt the supply of drugs, raise awareness of Child Criminal Exploitation (CCE) and safeguard victims.

County Lines is the name given to drug dealing where organised criminal groups from cities exploit young people from smaller towns and rural areas into moving and supplying drugs. The 'county line' is the mobile phone line used to take the orders of drugs.

Operational activity across the week resulted in;

- ♦ 38 arrests 5 individuals were charged with 11 separate offences
- ♦ 43 warrants carried out across Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland
- ♦ An ANPR operation which led to 6 vehicles being stop checked
- Weapons recovered including machetes, knives, knuckle dusters, air rifles, taser and a blank firing pistol
- ♦ Over £22,000 in cash being seized
- ♦ More than £120,000 worth of drugs seized
- Reached 7393 school pupils and 330 educational professionals with interactive preventative workshops
- ♦ 2 cars were seized
- Safeguarded 20 individuals and visited 7 properties suspected of being cuckooed properties
- ♦ Intelligence gathered for future warrants
- ♦ 38 stop searches and 2 arrests at Leicester Train Station with British Transport Police.
