## What matters to you

We have listened to you and the concerns you raised and prioritised the following:

### Priority 1: Anti-social Behaviour (ASB)

You said: General ASB often focuses on Blaby Precinct with youths gathering outside of shops and in the car park. ASB can also be noted in and around the open green spaces.

### Priority 2: Drug Dealing

You Said: You have raised drug dealing as a priority across the beat including residential and public locations.

### Priority 3: Road Safety

You Said: The Road Safety priority often focuses on speeding issues and includes residential and main arterial roads.

## What we have done #YouSaidWeDid

### Priority 1: Antisocial Behaviour (ASB) –

We Did: We continue to work with the housing association responsible for Needham Close on the issues reported there. Thankfully incidents have dropped massively no interventions are in place.

Further across the beat the end of the summer holidays saw very little ASB relating to young people which is fantastic. PCSO Calum has been to visit local schools since they have been back to feedback any issues over the summer.

### Priority 2: Drug Dealing—

We Did: The beat team have been working with our intelligence department to look at future enforcement on addresses we have been developing intelligence on. We continue to complete community consultation events across the beat to determine any further addresses of interest.

## What we have done #YouSaidWeDid

### Priority 3: Road Safety —

We Did: Towards the end of August, we had a slight increase in the reports of cars racing on the Blaby bypass in the evenings. Both our roads policing and response colleagues attended and dealt with those that remained behind.

In July the speed van visited the Blaby bypass for a total of 240 minutes and captured 13 vehicles in excess of the speed limit.

## Good News

Last weekend the beat team attended the Victory Show in Cosby with over 6000 people attending over the weekend. The event went off without incident and was thoroughly enjoyed by all attending. We are aware of parking issues further afield in around Croft Hill this will be fed back for next year's event planning.



### Further New - Investigation into Blaby fight continues

Police are continuing to investigate a fight in Blaby which left two men injured. Officers attended Lutterworth Road after receiving a call at 11.30pm on Friday 16 August to a report of a large fight involving up to 40 people outside a public house. During the incident, two men sustained injuries which were not life threatening or life changing injuries.

As part of their enquiries, two men have been arrested and charged. A 43-year-old man charged with actual bodily harm and possession of an offensive weapon in a public place was remanded to appear at Leicester Magistrates' Court on Friday 23 August. A 42-year-old man charged with affray, criminal damage and possessing a knife blade/sharp pointed article in a public place was remanded to appear at Leicester Magistrates' Court on Tuesday 20 August. A third man aged 18 was arrested on suspicion of affray and remains on police bail.

The investigation onto the incident remains ongoing and officers are appealing for anyone who may have been a victim or a witness and has not yet spoken to police to please get in touch.
