Beat Priorities – May 2026 Update

Our Beat Priorities for May 2026 remain the same as previous month. These priorities reflect the issues you told us that matters to you. They are based on feedback gathered through community surveys and supported by police data.

- **Priority 1: Anti Social Behaviour and Public Nuisance**

What we did: Preventative visible policing patrols carried out on Victoria park/ Granville Road car Park to help prevent and lower issues related to vehicle speeding and causing nuisance, we have also extended these patrols on to Upper New walk where additional ASB issues are highlighted.

- **Priority 2: Theft and Shoplifting**

Your local beat Officers have been engaging with local shops on Queens road /Clarendon Park road area and Morrisons Store to prevent and lower shoplifting, PC Gray and PC Rodgers who are our dedicated officers for retail crime are working along with your neighbourhood officers, PCSO 6652 and PCSO Bhatti assisted and detain a shop lifter at Sainsbury Store who was later arrested by PC Gray and PC Rodgers.

- **Priority 3: Violence and Night Time Economy Harm.**

“Over the coming month, officers will focus on supporting a safe night-time economy through visible patrols and close work with local venues and partners. Activity will target anti-social behaviour, vulnerability and peak-
