What matters to you



We have listened to you and the concerns you have raised through surveys, community consultations and analysing crime trends.

Using this data, we have created the following Uppingham Town priorities that the Dedicated Neighbourhood Team will focus their efforts on:

Priority 1: Road Safety.

You said: Speeding vehicles on Rutland roads is a priority you want us to address, specifically the lack of adherence to 30mph zones.

What we are going to do: We will complete high visibility patrols of hotspot areas with partner agencies and deal proactively with offenders with a view to providing suitable advice or action where required.

Priority 2: Drugs.

You Said: Drug dealing as well as drug use in the area.

We are going to do develop our intelligence picture around those who commit this type of crime so we that we can effectively target our resources in the right areas, at the right time, with the aim of deterring, disrupting and bringing offenders to justice.

Priority 3: Anti-Social Behaviour

You said: Specific issues of Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) concerning individuals in the community, 'nuisance neighbours' and irresponsible dog ownership / walking is an area you want us to focus on.

What we are going to do: We will provide a frequent high visibility policing presence, as part of a localised operation around Road Safety, to the affected areas with marked vehicle patrols and regular monitoring. We will deploy the speed gun device and deal with offenders robustly where appropriate. We will also continue to work with partner agencies, such as the Road Safety.

Anti-Social Behaviour. During July 26 the beat continued with regular patrols of areas of concern to residents. In conjunction with the Community Safety Team at Rutland County Council we continue to engage with victims, offenders and parents. Although reports have declined this month, we are aware this is still a high priority for local residents. Patrol plans have been shared with colleagues on the Melton Neighbour and Response Policing Teams and will continue over the summer.

Drugs. During July 26, the neighbourhood team have completed patrols areas concerned in the distribution of drugs in the town. We continue to treat drug activity as a key priority. We have been developing intelligence around individuals involved in drug use and dealing. This ongoing intelligence-led approach supports efforts to disrupt, deter, and bring offenders to justice, forming the foundation for targeted drug-related policing.

Road Safety. During July 26, Uppingham's beat team have continued to target community road-safety concerns. Officers maintained frequent high-visibility patrols, carried out speed monitoring with our speed gun and completed marked-vehicle stop checks using onboard ANPR equipment. The latter recently resulted in PC Stott dealing with a driver for further offences of no insurance and having no valid driver's licence.
