#YouSaid - What matters to you

We have listened to you, your concerns and will prioritise the following areas:

Priority 1: Criminality and Anti-Social Behaviour

Your Concerns: Cropston Close, Leicester has seen a considerable increase in crime and disorder in the last couple of months leading to officers being assaulted and numerous items of stolen property being recovered from the street.

Our Actions:

- A meeting with Riverside Housing on 9th October whereby we will identify those addresses causing the most harm.
- Plan how we can prevent their future offending.

Priority 2: Criminality and Anti-Social Behaviour

Your Concerns: Crime and disorder continue to be reported in Bonney Road including vehicles being stolen, disorder and person carrying weapons. These reports make residents feel unsafe in their own neighbourhood.

Our Actions:

- High visibility and plain clothed patrols are planned for Bonney Road.
- Applying for Leicestershire's first gang injunction at the County Court. This work seeks to disrupt the activities and offending being reported.

Priority 3: Dangerous Driving

Your Concerns: Dangerous and illegal use of vehicles around the Western Ward continue to be reported and raised as concerns by local residents especially at our Ward meeting during August.

Our Actions:


Operations planned for October.

Housing Evictions

Beat Surgeries

Outstanding suspect

The beat officers assisted when a male who has been outstanding for a long time was located. The male was successfully located and the Western beat team transported to custody.

Op Zig -Zag

Sgt Walters has been working with council and schools to get yellow lines repainted. Vehicles parked on zigzags outside schools have been dealt with accordingly.

Home visits

Home visits made to young people who are at risk of being exploited for criminal activity. It is important we try and do what we can in order to prevent the exploitation of children.
