### **Congratulations!**

Recognition for our officers and staff at the Local Policing Directorate Awards (LPD) held at Force Headquarters recently

Amazing examples of compassion, team work, bravery and professionalism were recognised at the Local Policing Directorate Chief Superintendent's Award Ceremony at force headquarters on Friday (14 April). More than 120 officers and staff were presented with 35 awards for Outstanding Work and Service Excellence including giving live saving first aid and CPR, helping people intent on taking their own lives, tackling County Lines and drug related crime and disorder, being exceptional neighbourhood officers and resolving complex issues on neighbourhoods.

The LPD Awards recognise excellent work by neighbourhood and response officers. They were presented by Chief Superintendent Jonny Starbuck and Superintendent Aimee Ramm.

Officers and Police staff from Melton Mowbray were among the recipients.

PC Matt Carmichael and PC Dan Daley were commended for saving the life of a young man who had gone missing after harming himself. The officer's investigation took them to a railway station in Lincolnshire where they stopped him trying to scale a fence which had 30-foot drop onto a live railway line on the other side. Despite resisting their attempts to save him, Dan and Matt were able to pull him to safety, get swift lifesaving first aid and prevent a possible


serious or fatal accident on the train track. While trying to restrain him, two high-speed trains passed along the track.
