

Dear Reader,

I am writing to provide an update on some significant positive outcomes achieved by local officers as part of our continued efforts to tackle serious violence, criminality, and anti-social behaviour affecting our communities.

Over recent weeks, officers have been targeting a group of individuals responsible for causing considerable harm and concern within local neighbourhoods. Through dedicated investigative work, proactive enforcement activity, and support from partner agencies, a number of key individuals have now been brought to justice.

The following outcomes were secured:

- **Juderoy DAVIS** and **Jacob GREEN** were arrested, charged, and remanded to court for **Grievous Bodily Harm with Intent**.
- **Shaun ASTILL** and **Kaiser ASTILL** have both been arrested, charged, and remanded to court for **Grievous Bodily Harm with Intent**. They have pleaded guilty to this offence.
- A male was arrested in connection with **two thefts of motor vehicles**. He was also charged and remanded to court for **breaching a Civil Order**.
- A male was arrested and remanded to court for **breaching an EMS Tag requirement**.

Alongside these arrests and charges, officers have identified and evidenced **more than ten breaches of Civil Injunctions** involving three principal members of the group. This demonstrates our determination to use every available legal power to disrupt those who seek to cause harm in our communities.

Operational activity has also led to the recovery of a number of motorcycles believed to be linked to criminality and anti-social behaviour. These seizures not only remove vehicles being used unlawfully but also contribute to improving safety and reducing nuisance for residents.

Detective Inspector Paul Hawkins, City CID, said:

"These positive outcomes are the result of a significant amount of investigative work and the close collaboration between City CID, neighbourhood policing teams and wider departments. My team has worked extensively to support these investigations, gathering evidence and ensuring offenders are brought before the courts wherever possible. This has been a genuine team effort, with officers and staff from across the force working together towards a common goal of protecting our communities and reducing the harm caused by those involved in serious criminality."

While these results represent a significant step forward, our work continues. We have further plans in place to target prolific offenders and those who persist in committing crime across West Leicester. Our message is clear: we will continue to pursue those who cause harm, hold offenders accountable, and work tirelessly to keep our neighbourhoods safe.

I would like to thank our communities for the information, intelligence, and support that have assisted these investigations. The information you provide remains invaluable and plays a vital role in helping us identify offenders, protect victims, and prevent further crime.

West Leicester Neighbourhood Policing Area remains committed to tackling violence, anti-social behaviour, and organised criminality. We will continue to listen to community concerns, act on intelligence, and ensure that those responsible for criminal activity are brought to justice.
