What matters to you

• Priority 1: Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) .

You said: That youths have been loitering and possibly consuming/dealing drugs in the location of Pendlebury Drive and causing Antiscial Behaviour (ASB).

We did: Regular patrols have been completed and we continue to worked closely with the local housing officers for the area. This included a Patch Walk allowing us to all attend the area and discuss all issues and any solutions and which authority is best placed to deal with the issues.

Priority 2: Burglaries.

You said: That you feel your neighbourhood has seen an increase in burglary.

We did: We have been on the beat patrolling and posting advice on social media to educate local residents about keeping your home safe and secure. Now the weather is improving we would strongly advice you all to resist leaving ground floor windows open, even when you are at home. It will not take an opportunist much time to enter your home through a ground floor open window while you are distracted in the garden perhaps. We will continue to conduct high visibility patrols and maintain a strong policing presence in the community, we will also be holding beat engagements for crime prevention tips. There has happily been a reduction in burglary compared to this time last year.

Priority 3: The use of illegal e-scooters/bikes across the area.

You said: You see e scooters/bikes travelling in the area, causing you some distress.

We did: The team have been and will continue conducting patrols to deter this use of illegal e scooter/bikes. Officers completed an OP on 22/04/25 which resulted in the seizure of an e scooter. The team plan on arranging special Op's to target these kind of offenders. This could result in advice, education or seizure, doing what we can to reduce this issue.

- We as a team held engagements at a number of locations in Knighton .We try to vary the days/times and locations giving an even spread over the area hopefully giving residents the opportunity to speak to us about any local issues. .
