We have listened to your concerns and prioritised the following:

Priority 1 - Tackling Parking Issues and Anti-Social Behaviour on Bishopdale

Following reports of dangerous parking and anti-social behaviour, particularly on Saturdays, officers have carried out regular high-visibility patrols to provide reassurance and address concerns. The team has engaged with residents and park users, offering advice around considerate parking and community responsibility. Officers have also been working to identify those involved in anti-social behaviour, using neighbourhood policing interventions such as warning letters, parental visits, and other measures aimed at preventing issues from escalating.

Priority 2 - Addressing Youth Anti-Social Behaviour at Beaumont Leys Shopping Centre

The Beat Team has been working closely with retailers, security staff, Leicester City Council, and shopping centre management to tackle anti-social behaviour linked to young people. Community engagement events and beat surgeries have provided opportunities to listen to businesses and residents, while a coordinated multi-agency approach has focused on those causing the greatest concern. Several young people have been spoken to and warned regarding their behaviour, and officers have made arrests for a variety of offences. One prolific juvenile offender has been charged with multiple offences and is subject to strict court-imposed bail conditions.

Priority 3 - Safeguarding Vulnerable Residents and Tackling Cuckooing

Officers have been working alongside Leicester City Council and partner agencies to protect vulnerable residents who were believed to be at risk of exploitation and cuckooing in the Grassington Close area. Regular welfare visits have been conducted to provide support and monitor concerns, leading to two arrests as part of ongoing investigations. Strict bail conditions have been imposed on suspects to reduce the risk of further harm while enquiries continue. The Beat Team remains committed to safeguarding vulnerable people and working with partners to ensure they receive ongoing support and protection.

Local News - August

Located stolen motorbikes recovered

Throughout August, the Beaumont Leys Beat Team continued to focus on tackling anti-social behaviour, supporting local residents, and carrying out proactive patrols across the ward. Key activity included:

- Conducted **high-visibility patrols** in and around Beaumont Leys, particularly in areas where residents had raised concerns about anti-social behaviour and nuisance activity.
- Continued work to address **anti-social behaviour at Beaumont Shopping Centre**, working closely with retailers, security staff, and partner agencies to identify offenders and reduce incidents.

Priority Patrols

- Used an **incremental approach to tackle youth-related ASB**, including words of advice, warning letters, engagement with parents and guardians, and referrals to support services where appropriate.

- Maintained a strong focus on **shoplifting and retail crime**, identifying and dealing with offenders alongside shopping centre management and local businesses.

- Carried out patrols and engagement around **parking and anti-social behaviour concerns on Bishopdale**, providing reassurance to residents and advice to visitors regarding considerate parking.

Beat Surgery

- Continued efforts to tackle the misuse of **e-scooters and other vehicles**, including enforcement action where necessary and responding to community concerns.

- Attended local incidents and responded to concerns regarding **groups of young people gathering in public spaces**, gathering intelligence and taking appropriate action where offenders were identified.

- Engaged with residents through **Neighbourhood Link updates, beat surgeries and community conversations**, encouraging reporting of issues and keeping the community informed about local policing activity.

- Worked with partners including housing providers, community safety teams, businesses and youth services to develop **long-term solutions to recurring community issues**.
