## #YouSaid - What matters to you

**We have listened to you and the concerns you raised and the following:**

**Your Concern:** We understand that **drug use, drug dealing**, and the associated criminal activity are causing significant concern within the community.

**Our Response:** Tackling drug dealing remains a key priority for the Melton Town South policing team. Recent work has included targeted enforcement action, successful closure orders at problem addresses, and proactive operations leading to arrests for Class A drug supply and the recovery of drugs. Officers continue to work closely with partner agencies to disrupt drug related harm, safeguard vulnerable residents and address concerns raised by the community.

**Your Concern:** **Anti-social behaviour** is a major concern for many residents on the beat.

**Our Response:** Officers have carried out high visibility foot and vehicle patrols in identified hotspot areas, responded to reports from residents, and worked closely with partner agencies to deter further incidents. These patrols aim to reassure the community, address ongoing concerns and deliver longer term improvements for those affected.

**Your Concern:** **Speeding and road safety** across the beat have been highlighted as key concerns by members of the community.

**Our Response:** Officers carried out checks on roads where residents had raised concerns, including Kirby Lane, and conducted high visibility vehicle patrols to deter speeding and improve compliance. These actions aim to improve safety for all road users and reassure local residents.

## #WeDid - What we are doing

Officers carried out joint visits with the Department for Work and Pensions (DWP), engaging with residents to ensure they are receiving the correct advice and support.

Safeguarding continues to be a priority, with officers conducting regular visits to vulnerable individuals. Joint visits with social services have helped provide reassurance and support where it is most needed.

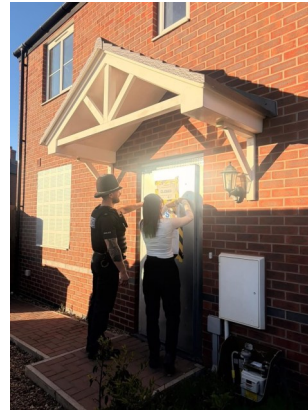
### Clerical and Follow Up Work

A portion of my time was dedicated to essential administrative duties, including logging recent incidents, reviewing outstanding reports, and following up on ongoing cases. Although this side of the role often goes unseen, it is vital to ensuring that investigations progress smoothly and that all information is recorded accurately.

## #WeDid—What we are doing continued



**Summary:** A partial closure order and a full closure order were successfully granted for two addresses within the beat.

Both orders were executed the same day in partnership with housing officers and council services, with one property fully secured.

The closure orders will remain in place for a minimum of three months.

A vulnerable resident at the partially closed address will continue to receive safeguarding support through joint agency work.

Drug dealing and anti-social behaviour remain key priorities, and officers continue targeted patrols and problem solving activity.

**Local Policing Activity:** Officers conducted high-visibility foot and vehicle patrols across the Town South area to reassure residents and deter crime.

CCTV and house-to-house enquiries were completed following reports of criminal damage and other incidents.

Speed-calming checks were carried out in response to community concerns about speeding.

Victims of crime were contacted to provide reassurance and ongoing support.

Community and Safeguarding Work

Welfare visits were completed to help safeguard vulnerable individuals.

Officers carried out joint visits with partner agencies, including social services and the Department for Work and Pensions.

Ongoing engagement with local offenders continues to reduce reoffending and identify support pathways.

### **Enforcement and Emergency Support**

Officers supported serious criminal investigations, including arrests for Class A drug supply.

Assistance was provided at live emergency incidents alongside East Midlands Ambulance Service.

A proactive operation led to multiple arrests and significant drug seizures within the community.

### **Schools and Community Engagement**

Officers visited Long Field Academy to build positive relationships and gather intelligence.

Support was provided to St Francis Primary School during a sponsored walk, helping pupils raise money for chosen charities.

Engagement events continue to build trust, visibility and positive relationships across Melton Town South.

## Continued

On Thursday 2 April, officers from the Melton Town South Beat Team attended Leicester Magistrates' Court alongside the Safer Communities Team from Melton Borough Council.

The Council applied for a partial closure order at one address and a full closure order at a second address within the beat. Officers supported both applications by providing evidence to the court.

Both closure orders were granted. Later that same day, officers worked in partnership with the Safer Communities Team and housing officers to serve and execute the orders. The address subject to the full closure order was successfully secured. Both orders will remain in place for a minimum of three months.

The female resident at the partially closed address, who officers believe may be vulnerable to cuckooing, will continue to receive support through joint work with partner agencies. Any unauthorised person found at the property during this period will be liable for arrest for breaching the closure order.

### ☐ Crime & Patrols

We have been supporting our response teams with **live incidents** throughout **March** too and completing high visible patrols often on foot in some of our hotspot areas.

**Teamwork** with other beat officers from our neighbouring beats, assisting them with visiting vulnerable persons, dealing with suspects of criminal activity and ongoing neighbour disputes.

### ☐ Safeguarding & Welfare

Officers responded to **mental health-related welfare concerns**, including submitting a **safeguarding report** with the individual's consent.

### ☐ Station Duties

• The team also supported the **front enquiry office**, handling a wide range of public enquiries including criminal reports, intelligence sharing, and general queries.

- We continue to deal with local issues such as Anti-social behaviour and safeguard vulnerable residents and cuckooing victims as and when we identify concerns.
- Our work is ongoing with local schools including engagement events.
- And lastly as 'Dedicated Neighbourhood Officers' we continue to work on and try find solutions with neighbour disputes. We also support our response colleagues and cover the front enquiry office too.
