What matters to you

We have listened to you and the concerns you raised and will Prioritize the following from March 2025.

Priority 1: ASB. You said: You have concerns around anti- social behavior across the village. We will continue to try and disrupt this type of behavior and use the ASB incremental approach to deter offenders.

Priority 2: Speeding. You said: You are concerned about vehicles speeding in the villages. We will continue to monitor and enforce speed across several sites in the village.

Priority 3: Burglaries. We aim to work with the relevant authorities to reduce the burglaries across the village and to try and reduce the number of reported thefts from the recycling Centre. Visiting victims and prevention advice.

March

Priority 1: The beat team aim to tackle different elements of ASB in Mountsorrel

This month we received a report of anti-social behavior and criminal damage at Mountsorrel Memorial Playing Fields. Officers attended, and an investigation is currently ongoing. We are reviewing all available information, including CCTV opportunities and witness accounts, to identify those involved. We will provide a further update once we have more details to share.

Since the original report, no further issues have been recorded at the location.. We would still encourage residents to report anything they see as soon as possible — early reporting helps us respond quickly and effectively.

We continue proactive patrols in known ASB hotspots, including, The Green, Halstead Park, Mountsorrel Memorial Centre

These patrols aim not only to prevent anti-social behavior but also to provide reassurance to local residents and visitors using these spaces. If you see our officers out and about, please feel free to stop and speak with us — we welcome feedback and local insights.

Priority 2: The beat team aim to target reports of speeding in Mountsorrel.

Speed Ops

Following concerns from residents about speeding vehicles along Walton Way, officers carried out targeted speed checks throughout the month. More than 100 vehicles were monitored using speed detection equipment, with two drivers found to be exceeding the limit.

Although the majority of motorists were driving responsibly, speeding remains a key concern for many in the community. Even minor increases in speed can significantly raise the risk of serious injury, so we are committed to ongoing monitoring.

Priority 3: Burglaries

High-visibility patrols continue across the village both day and night, supported by neighborhood and response officers. These patrols aim to deter burglars and provide reassurance to residents, particularly during darker evening hours when offences are more likely to occur.

Our policing approach remains firmly rooted in partnership with residents. Many of the issues we address each month come directly from community reports, so we want to thank everyone who takes the time to get in touch. Whether it's concerns about ASB, suspicious activity, or road safety, your information plays a vital role in keeping the village safe. We encourage you to continue using the available reporting channels:

- 999 for emergencies.
- 101 or the online reporting form for non-urgent matters.
- Direct contact with the Neighbourhood Policing Team for community concerns
