What matters to you

We have listened to you and the concerns you raised and will prioritise the following in October 2023.

Priority 1: Antisocial Behaviour (ASB)

You said: General ASB often focuses around Blaby Precinct with youths gathering outside of shops and in the car park. ASB can also be noted in and around the open green spaces.

Priority 2: Nuisance Motorbikes

You Said: We have received reports of ASB related behaviour. Behaviour regularly coincides with the use of motorcycles/mopeds/e-scooters.

Priority 3: Road Safety

You Said: The Road Safety priority often focuses around speeding issues and includes residential and main arterial roads.

Priority 4: Vehicle Crime

You Said: Vehicle crime including the theft from or of motor vehicles is present on the NH21 beat and spikes are often noted in the Glen Parva and Blaby areas.

What we are doing

Priority 1: Antisocial Behaviour (ASB) - We Did: The beat team continue to patrol hotspot locations including the play park on The Crescent, Blaby. Now the schools are back out targeted patrols will be in the evenings and over the weekends. We are working with the parish council who have CCTV at the location to help us identify perpetrators

Priority 2: Nuisance Motorbikes— **We Did:** This month has seen very few reports of nuisance motorbikes however small spikes were seen at Oakfield Park, Northfield Park in Blaby and the playing fields off of Dorothy Avenue, Glen Parva . Your beat team will be patrolling these areas to try and catch perpetrators.

Priority 3: Road Safety — **We Did:** The beat team continue to work with partner agencies regarding street racing on the Blaby by pass. The Road Safety Partnership has added the by pass to its list of community concern sites for the speed van to visit.

Priority 4: Vehicle Crime — **We Did:** Last month saw us have a small number of keyless vehicle theft as well as a very small number of theft of tools from vans at the start of Sept. The beat team are assisting with enquiries into these thefts.
