Numerous reports have been received by the beat team around the use of off road motorcycles in an anti-social manner.	Officers are trying to obtain the details of 3 motorcyclists seen driving in an anti-social manner in Countesthorpe. Enquiries continue.
There are road safety issues at Greenfield School as cars have been blocking the road and pavements. Parking over driveways at school time near the Academy in Countesthorpe.	The issues are continuous outside the Greenfields Primary School. Parents are parking their cars on footpaths and blocking the road and footpath. Additional enforcement is planned.
Reports of speeding within the villages.	PCSO Kirsty is regularly attending Kilby to monitor the traffic situation. She has been in talks with Kilby Parish Council and our Traffic department in relation to additional double yellow lines.

News

Our Officers are never off duty, an off duty officer travelling down Foston Road in Countesthorpe noticed a vehicle in front driving slowly and drifting a number of times into the verge before correcting itself. The driver of the vehicle pulled into a side street and parked, our off duty Officer followed the vehicle and spoke to the driver in case they were having a medical emergency. It quickly became evident the female occupant was intoxicated. This occurred at 15:30 on a Friday afternoon just after children had finished school. Local Officers were called to assist and to conduct a road side breath test. The female blew 5 times the legal limit and was promptly arrested at the scene and transported to custody.

A man has been charged with 7 thefts from shops after being detained by staff at the Tesco store in Countesthorpe. The male was wanted for several thefts around the County and the staff at the store were integral in capturing this male. The male is set to appear in Court at the end of the month.

We are still receiving calls in relation to dangerous parking on Wheatlands Drive in Countesthorpe, a call was received from a resident stating they'd had to walk into the road with their pushchair to get around a vehicle blocking the pavement. This road can get extremely busy so please be mindful of where you park.
