We have listened to you and the concerns you raise

Our beat priorities continue to be:

Priority 1: ASB. What we are going to do: The beat team aim to tackle incidences of ASB within the villages including the parks and beauty spots of Charnwood West utilising ASB and civil legislation and patrols in locations identified as subject to ASB.

Priority 2: Speeding and Road safety. What we are going to do: The beat team will deal with issues of road safety and speeding in Charnwood West villages. If you believe that there is an issue in your area, let the beat team know.

Priority 3: Drugs. What we are going to do: The beat team will deal with incidences of drug use and dealing across the beat area. Patrolling identified areas, utilising stop search powers where available and develop intelligence to allow us to target dealing within your area.

The Charnwood West Dedicated Neighbourhood Team have been working throughout December to tackle our chosen priorities of Speeding and Road Traffic Safety, Anti Social Behaviour and Drugs (including use and drug dealing).

All the team featuring Sergeant Adkin, PC Nicholson, PCSO Martin and PCSO Colley have been working both out on the beat engaging with the community, and completing essential behind the scenes administrative work on the below and other aspects of policing:

Drugs and Drug Dealing

In December, the NL56 Charnwood West Beat Team maintained a proactive approach to addressing drug-related concerns within our communities. Our officers carried out high-visibility patrols in both marked and unmarked police vehicles and out on foot in areas linked to drug use and supply, concentrating on Quorn, Rothley, Swithland, and Woodhouse Eaves. These patrols were supported by intelligence gathering on individuals and locations suspected of involvement in drug activity, which is now being developed to assist ongoing investigations. As part of this work, one individual received a conditional caution for drug offences. We continue to work closely with the Neighbourhood Priority Team to target properties and hotspots connected to drug-related activity, reinforcing our commitment to reducing harm and keeping our area safe. Residents play a vital role in tackling this issue. If you notice suspicious behaviour such as frequent visitors at unusual hours or strong smells associated with drug use please report it to us. Information can be shared anonymously via Crimestoppers or directly through the Leicestershire Police website. Every report helps us build intelligence and take action against those involved in illegal drug activity.

Anti-Social Behaviour

Throughout December, the NL56 Charnwood West Beat Team has continued to focus on reducing anti-social behaviour (ASB) across our villages. Community Protection Warnings (CPNs) have been issued to residents at addresses in Quorn, and we have carried out visits and sent letters regarding reports of inconsiderate parking in Rothley. Further visits are planned to another address in Rothley following reports of ASB. We have maintained close contact with local schools to support them in addressing any concerns and to strengthen our partnership approach. Alongside these actions, officers have continued regular patrols in all villages and ASB hotspots reported to us, ensuring visibility and reassurance. We have also visited victims of ASB to provide support and guidance. The beat team remains committed to working with partners and the community to tackle ASB and keep our area safe. If you witness or experience anti-social behaviour, please report it to us via 101, the Leicestershire Police website or by contacting your local beat team.

Speeding and Road Traffic Safety

Throughout December, the NL56 Charnwood West Beat Team continued to address speeding concerns raised by local residents. We carried out two speed enforcement operations: one on Meynell Road in Quorn and another on Brand Hill in Woodhouse Eaves. We are pleased to report that, on both occasions, all drivers adhered to the 30mph speed limit while officers were present with the speed gun. Speeding remains a key concern for community safety, as excessive speed reduces reaction time and increases the severity of collisions. We encourage all motorists to remain vigilant, especially in residential areas, near schools, and on rural roads where hazards can appear suddenly. Simple steps such as planning extra time for journeys, regularly checking your speedometer, and being mindful of changing speed limits can make a big difference. We will continue to carry out speed operations where possible and maintain high-visibility patrols to deter speeding in areas highlighted by residents.
