You said - We did

- Speeding (34 votes on Neighbourhood Link (NHL)) . Between 01/03/2026 and 31/03/2026 the mobile speed camera visited the A47 twice, Kibworth A6 once, and Newton Harcourt once. In total thirty offences were detected.
- Anti social behaviour (21 votes on NHL) - identifying individuals causing the anti social behaviour. Passing their names to the council to start the incremental approach. Targeting areas of known ASB activity.
- Nuisance motorbikes (19 votes on NHL) - We have been conducting uniformed and marked vehicle patrols in the areas you have told us this is a problem. We have directed officers to these areas in any down time they have to deter these offenders from causing problems in these areas.

With the longer days and weather getting better, a timely reminder about ebikes and escooters.

- It is illegal to ride a privately owned e scooter in public spaces, including pavements/footpaths, roads, parks, and other public areas.
- Privately owned e scooters may only be used on private land with the landowner's permission.
- If you are caught riding a privately owned e scooter in public, it may be seized by police.

An e bike is treated the same as a normal pedal cycle only if it:

- Has pedals that can propel it
- Has a motor with a maximum continuous rated power of 250 watts and the motor assistance cuts out at 15.5mph (25km/h). The rider must be aged 14 or over. E bikes that do not meet these rules (including some modified/higher powered bikes) are treated as motor vehicles rather than an EAPC.
- If someone is riding dangerously and there is an immediate risk to the public, call 999. Otherwise report via 101 or online.
