You Said	We did
<p>Anti social behaviour including e-scooters electric bikes, environmental, targeted or nuisance behaviour from individuals or groups.</p>	<p>We continue to investigate reports of anti-social behaviour at McDonald's, Fosse Park. These incidents are being taken seriously and appropriate action is being taken against those involved. We are also dealing with ASB issues across the beat in hotspot areas like Bradgate Close, Whistle Way, Narborough Park and Tay Road. This is mainly down to Motorbikes, dirt bikes and quad bikes as well as groups of youths causing noise, abusive behaviour and general nuisance. The beat team will continue to monitor and investigate over the coming months.</p>
<p>Drugs is a priority, this includes drug use in public spaces as well as reports of drug use in dwellings, drug driving and any intelligence concerning selling and distributing and education around drug use.</p>	<p>The beat team receive reports of drug use from neighbour disputes or storm and niche reports, this is then sent in for intelligence and investigation. Your beat team also deal with any drug use on the beat with patrols and visits.</p>
<p>Road Safety issues:- Road safety including speeding, improper use of the road, and road traffic offences.</p>	<p>The team have regular reports of abandoned vehicles across the beat, we make sure the documentation is in order and deal either with words of advice, tickets for obstruction and advice notices as well as recovery of vehicles. We also deal with RTC's and Section 59's on the beat and often complete speeding ops in problem areas.</p>

News

PCSO Sarah returned back after a nice Easter Break and spent the first few days patrolling around the beat, focusing on hot spot areas like Bradgate Close regarding the ongoing reports of youths causing anti social behaviour. Any youths spoken to will be added to our running report we are using alongside Blaby District Council. Words of advice will be given to parents and youths regarding appropriate behaviour in this area.

PCSO Sarah joined the local coffee morning in Littlethorpe along with our Safeguarding colleagues to give crime prevention advice and goodies, as well as fraud and scamming advice. This was very well received and attendance was good, the residents and group coordinators were so welcoming. She will be arranging a few more drop in sessions as this was very beneficial for the area. If you would like Sarah to attend any groups, coffee mornings, primary school talks regarding road safety, or local youth or resident groups regarding crime prevention, or local advice regarding any crime or issues you may be having or you just want to meet your local officer then let us know. Officers responded to an emergency report of a male assaulting a female on a bus at Fosse Park before making off from the scene. A thorough area search was carried out by PC Jodie, PC Dave and PC Gem. The suspect was located a short time later, heavily intoxicated and, rather unusually, in possession of a rather large quantity of fish. He was promptly arrested and taken into custody, where he continued to make his feelings known — loudly, requesting his “freedom”. The male was subsequently charged with Common Assault on 1 person and Battery on another.

I’m incredibly proud to share that Op Detect / Safer Streets won the Leicestershire Police Problem Solving Award, recognising our work dealing with spree and repeat offenders across the Hinckley and Braunstone areas. This work has delivered real results, achieving over 2,000 detections, securing 11 Criminal Behaviour Orders, and remanding more than 100 prisoners linked to spree crime. The team have focused on proactively identifying prolific offenders, strengthening evidence capture, and effective problem solving through strong partnerships with retailers, store security, and wider criminal justice partners. Presenting our work alongside five other excellent finalist teams, being recognised by an expert panel is a huge reflection of the effort, collaboration, and professionalism across the whole team. A thoroughly well deserved achievement — congratulations to everyone involved.
