### What matters to you

We have revised our beat priorities as of October 2025 to reflect what we have been told concerns the community most.

Priority 1: Commercial Burglaries:

What we did: Consultations have been taking place with the businesses in the Clarendon Park Road and Queens Road

with a focus on limiting vulnerabilities in businesses and reassuring proprietors that we will do all we can to minimise the impact on businesses and the community as a whole.

Priority 2: Victoria Park Car Park vehicle ASB.

**What we did:** Our Road Traffic Policing team have been visiting Victoria Park car park throughout the month along with local officers working alongside Civil Enforcement Officers to deter vehicle related ASB—on each visit, a vehicle has received a notice or has been seized.

 Priority 3: Vehicle Crime - We will carry on with our initiatives to remind and re-educate about vehicle security over the winter months.

**What we Did:** Ongoing patrols by the beat team in quieter side streets as the nights have drawn in — checks on vulnerable/seemingly abandoned vehicles.

#### **Other Local News**

- **Autumn events**—Autumn brings a lot of new events in the area of Clarendon Park—chances are you may see your local beat team in attendance. We encourage you to come and speak to us.
- Op Halloween/Spark—These ops are in place to lessen the impact of ASB during festive periods.
- **Cold Calling** We have been receiving reports of a cold caller asking for money at doorsteps in the neighbourhood. We encourage the following in response as we work towards dealing with the individual:

Do not open the door to anyone unfamiliar

Do not give money at the door

Report visits to police online or through 101 (999 in emergencies)
