Your Dedicated Neighbourhood Team (DNT) is a group of local Officers dedicated to serving your community. The team is made up of Officers based in your area and supported by the wider Policing family.

Your priorities are chosen quarterly and are based upon information gathered through NHL (Neighbourhood Link), social media, local engagement, and emerging crime trends. You have stated that the following key themes are important to you. #YouSaidWeDid

You Said	We did
Burglary has been raised as a priority by residents. This will primarily be residential but there are a number of commercial premises in the NH19 area as well.	There is an emerging trend on the beat whereby unoccupied properties seem to be targeted. The Beat team are carrying out targeted patrols and providing safeguarding advice. Investigations are on-going to identify offenders.
General anti-social behaviour has been raised as a priority by local residents. This includes nuisance by youths at the Meridian Leisure Park	ASB in relation to youths causing issues at an abandoned building on Camden Road, Braunstone Town. Patrols continue on Darien Way, Thrope Astley. Ongoing enquires to identify the offenders. ECINS created.
Road Safety including off road motorbikes, speeding and other general road safety issues raised as a priority by Neighbourhood Link	The beat team conducted a speeding operation at two locations on Thorpe Astley and over 30 vehicles were checked. Most were compliant, however several drivers were issued advice over their speed. No tickets were issued on this occasion.

News

Over the Easter period PCSO Duane was visiting the children's residential care homes across the beat, updating records of the partner agencies and the residents. There are multiple benefits of a close working relationship with these facilities, we have up to date records of partner agencies allowing good communication and resolving any solutions swiftly; having current details of a vulnerable young person will facilitate the appropriate responses; arranging regular visits improves relations between the residents and police, making future incidents easier to resolve; residents learn about the effects of their choices via a different professional person. All of these over time reduces the incidents these young people are involved in, freeing up our Response Teams to attend other incidents across the district. For the most part, these facilities go unnoticed by neighbours. Its important to remember that its important that these children have the opportunity to grow up in as normal a setting as possible and this means in your community. Thankfully, unlike some areas, none of the



homes have any ongoing problems with any of their neighbours.

PCSO Ryan and PCSO Duane have also been patrolling Mossdale Meadows and Franklin Park as part of our Anti-Social Behaviour Priority for the area. Thankfully, the parks were being well used by a variety of children and parents and we haven't had any reports of ASB made to us on the parks so far.

Yesterday PCSO Ryan and I visited the residents at Peverel Court where they are experiencing some ASB from youths at the weekends in the evenings. We let them know what we are doing about it, reassuring them that action is being taken and had a nice chat about some other concerns they have. Today, PCSO Duane met with the Anti-Social Behaviour officer for EMH and discussed the matter among many others. One off incidents will often occur but we're committed to combatting ongoing ASB wherever it occurs and dealing with ongoing issues to improve the enjoyment of the local area for residents and visitors.
