Your Dedicated Neighbourhood Team (DNT) is a group of local Officers dedicated to serving your community. The team is made up of Officers based in your area, supported by the wider Policing family.



You Said	We did
<b>Priority 1:- ASB</b> General ASB often focuses around Blaby Precinct with youths gathering outside of shops and in the car park. ASB can also be noted in and around the open green spaces.	Officers have attended reports of anti-social behaviour revolving around rowdy gatherings within the Blaby area. Officers attended a report which led to the arrest of a suspected drink driver. Officers continue to deploy high visibility patrols to monitor and deter anti-social behaviour.
<b>Priority 2:- Drug Dealing</b> The drug dealing priority often focuses on residential properties however extends to parks and open spaces.	Officers have been conducting a range of different patrol methods to disrupt and catch suspected drug dealers. If you have information around drug dealing please feed it through via crimestoppers or directly through to Leics Police.

## News

During the month we received reports of a male walking up and down peoples driveways in the Hillview Drive area of Cosby late in the evening. The beat team and our roads policing unit promptly responded and patrolled the area. Whilst the male was not located the team remained within Cosby until the end of their shift. No reported crimes within Cosby came in overnight.



During this month we have been working on Operation Alliances, the first national intensification week focused on tackling vehicle crime.

During the intensification week, several offenders were arrested, who were conspiring to commit burglaries and steal motor vehicles, and local Officers have been conducting patrols in hotspot areas. Our Officers have also been heading into their local areas to discuss the impact of vehicle crime, share crime prevention advice and hand out crime prevention tools, such as security pouches and steering locks. Chief Inspector Richard Jackson, the force lead for Vehicle Crime said: "Nationally, 316 stolen vehicles were recovered, valued at over £4m in total, and 180 arrests were made in relation to vehicle crime.."



Over the coming weeks we will see celebrations for Halloween, Diwali and Bonfire Night and unfortunately at this time of the year there are Individuals who use this occasion as an excuse to cause trouble for residents. It is essential to remember the importance of celebrating safely and respecting those who choose to not take part.

Remember....

- You must be 18 or over to purchase fireworks.
- For Halloween only visit properties with displays/pumpkins etc.
- There is a Midnight curfew for fireworks during Bonfire Night.
- There is a 1am curfew for fireworks during Diwali.
- Be kind to your neighbours especially with pets and choose to attend an organised display.
- Allow children to carry torches or glow sticks to allow drivers to see them.
- Finally, have fun, be respectful and stay safe.

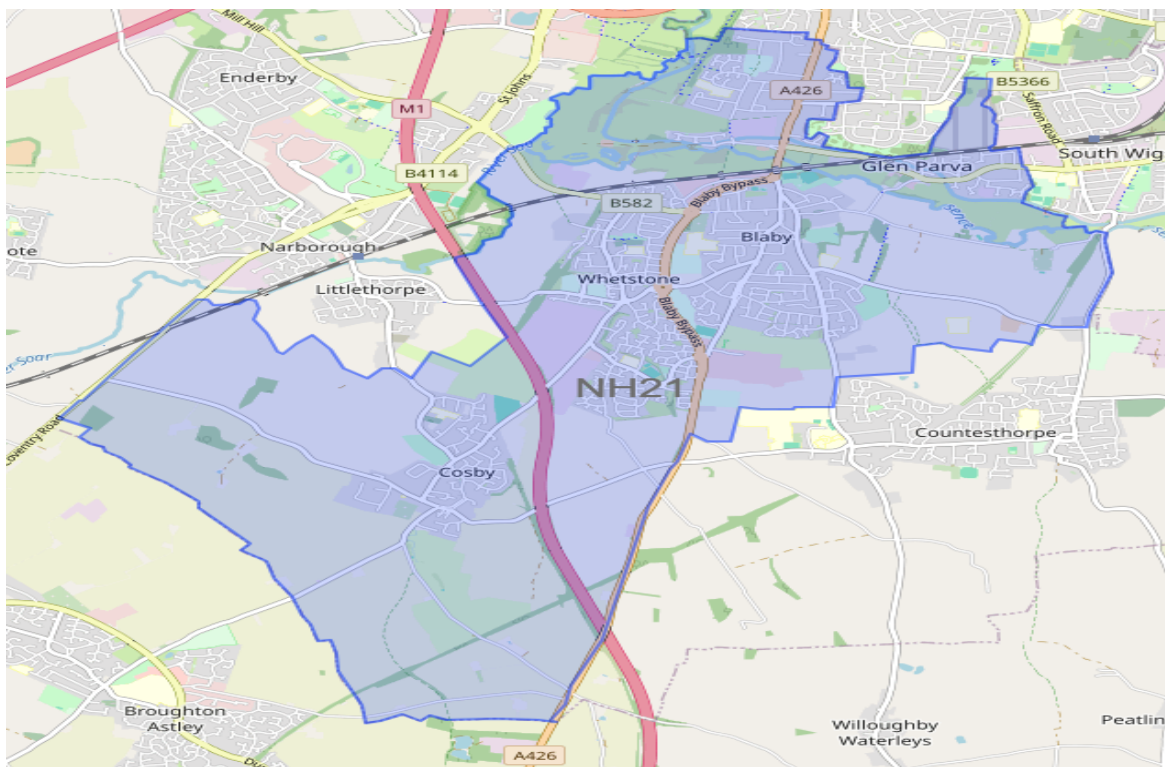
