Beat Priorities – March 2026 Update

Our beat priorities remain the same as those set in February 2026. These priorities reflect the issues you told us matter most to you. They are based on feedback gathered through community surveys and supported by police data.

Priority 1: You Said: Commercial Burglaries

What we did:

There was **one commercial burglary** reported in February, which occurred at the University. Police investigations are ongoing, and we continue to patrol and work closely with our partner agencies to prevent further incidents.

Priority 2: You Said: Vehicle Anti-Social Behaviour – Victoria Park / Granville Road Car Park

What we did:

We received fewer reports of vehicle related ASB in February, some were related to noise and speeding during the early hours. Our Roads Policing Team continues to carry out regular patrols in the area and take appropriate action against vehicles being used in an anti-social manner.

Priority 3: You Said: Vehicle Crime

What we did:

There were two vehicle crimes reported in February. Your dedicated Neighbourhood Policing Team will continue to carry out targeted patrols during late evenings and also use our social media channels to remind vehicle owners about improving vehicle security.
