After a quick chat with our friends at Immigration Services, the suspect was arrested for immigration offences and taken straight to custody, where the immigration team will take things from here.

Recently, as part of Op Syphon, officers were out on East Park Road outside the shops to tackle issues affecting the community.

- Vehicles causing unnecessary obstruction – tickets issued.
- E-scooters seized – many people think e-scooters are harmless fun, but if they are not insured, registered, and road-legal, they cannot be used on public roads. They are treated like motor vehicles under the law.
- Local businesses engaged with – listening to concerns and working together for a safer, more accessible area.

And let's tackle a common myth:

- "You can park on double yellow lines for 10 minutes" – WRONG! There's no grace period. Double yellows mean no waiting at any time, unless signs say otherwise.
