<b>Burglaries both residential and commercial.</b>	Residential Burglary – Station Street, Whetstone. Two males enter a farmhouse taking items before being disturbed by the owners and making off. An investigation is still ongoing.
<b>General ASB, congregating youths e-scooters and bikes.</b>	See below for full update.
<b>Road Safety including car cruising, anti-social driving and vehicle safety has been highlighted by the public as an issue.</b>	Officers attended Blaby Bypass after reports of vehicles speeding. Officers will take action by means of Section 59, seizure or ticket.

## News



We're pleased to introduce PCSO 6622 Vicki, who is currently being tutored and will soon be joining the Blaby, Cosby, Glen Parva and Whetstone beat team. PCSO's Vicki and Calum have spent time out on patrol in Glen Parva Nature Reserve and along the Great Central Way, following a recent rise in reports of anti-social behaviour in the area. We have also issued ASB warning letters to a group who have been trespassing on private land and causing damage, as part of our ongoing work to address concerns raised by the local community.

Officers investigating an attempted robbery in Blaby are appealing for witnesses or anyone with information to come forward. The incident happened at the underpass for the Blaby bypass between Stretton Court and College Road between 5pm and 6pm on Tuesday 28 April. Two 11-year-old boys were approached by two males on e-bikes, who demanded they hand over their pushbikes. When they refused, one of the males produced a knife and caused a cut to one of the boys' arm. The boys said a woman who was passing by also stopped to try and help. Neither pushbike was taken during the incident. Detective Constable Katie Burn, the investigating officer, said: "I'd like to speak to anyone who might be able to help with our enquiries. "I'm also appealing for anyone who used the underpass that Tuesday evening and who saw two males on e-bikes in the area to get in touch. Anti-social behaviour was taking place on private land on Station Street, Whetstone. This included reports of young people trespassing, causing damage to a window, and breaking objects. We have listened and taken action. We understand the impact incidents like this can have on the local community, and we want to reassure you that concerns raised are taken seriously and responded to appropriately. Myself and PCSO Calum have been actively looking into these incidents and carrying out enquiries with those involved. As part of an early intervention approach, ASB advice letters have been issued to the parents or guardians of five young people. These letters are designed to raise awareness, encourage positive behaviour and give families the opportunity to address concerns at an early stage. We're pleased to say that most of parents and guardians have responded positively upon being made aware of the incidents, and have taken steps to address their child's behaviour. This is really encouraging and highlights the importance of working together to prevent further issues.
