Your Neighbourhood beat team is dedicated to act on what matters to you most and focused to lower crime and deal with those who cause harm in our communities.

From what you have told us and information gathered from our local neighbourhood community surveys, crime trends/crime mapping, the beat team will focus on the following Priorities:

Priority 1: Anti-social behaviour (ASB) including drug use in the area of Victoria Park Road.

You said: ASB—you have made us aware of issues related to ASB on the beat area: St Leonards Road/ Howard Road/ Hartopp Road and Victoria Park Rd, you also highlighted and raised concerns around drug misuse occurring on open spaces.

We did: Beat team has carried out visible patrols at the identified locations of Anti Social Behaviour, officer's will deal with any perpetrators in collaboration with our partnership agencies to tackle ASB, you may have notice through our South Leicestershire Police Social Media Platform, we regularly keep our neighbourhood community and local residents informed of the our proactive Patrols & Engagements, we have acted on your reports of ASB and managed your expectations, where possible, we have attended incidents and updated callers with our ASB call back service, we have seen a reduction in ASB in the Clarendon Park Rd Gardens/ Children Play area.

Priority 2: E-scooters

You said: You made us aware of E-scooters causing concerns in the area and this will remains as our current beat priority.

We did: On Friday 31st January 2025 your local beat officer's acted on community concerns and conducted an e-scooter operation in the Clarendon Park area, on Queens Rd, where we have issued Section 59 warnings and taken formal action with those who were stopped and spoken to, we will continue to monitor and deal with E– scooters.

Priority 3: Burglaries at business premises in the area of Queens Road.

You said: Burglary concerns on Queens Road in the Clarendon Park was raised as a local Business and community concern, after our Police & Community liaison meeting, The beat team has responded by making this has our Police Beat priority with robust Police actions for your raised concerns.

We did: we have responded with additional visible proactive Policing patrols on Queens road and adjacent streets, Policing patrols were also introduced during the night to help prevent and to identify offenders furthermore to reassure our business/ residential communities, officer's conducted visits to all businesses on Queens Rd, Increased police patrols has seen a decrease in Burglaries over the past months and we will continue to patrol and provide regular updates through our Social Media and Newsletters.
