Coalville Beat Priorities: April – June 2026

ASB in local authority and privately run car parks

You said: We are aware of continued issues with inconsiderate drivers causing general ASB within local car parks.

We will: We are working with local security and CCTV operatives to run specific operations to address this issue. We will spend time monitoring the car parks and any misuse will be dealt with as appropriate.

Drug dealing and associated ASB within the town centre beat.

You Said: You have raised concerns regarding drug use and the anti-social behaviour associated with this type of criminality.

We Will: We have received several reports relating to issues surrounding drug use in our town centre. We are looking at enforcement options and working with partners to tackle the issue.

School Parking and traffic issues.

You Said: You have raised concerns relating to road safety, specifically surrounding our local primary schools. This includes driving at excess speed for the location, inappropriate road use and dangerous parking.

We Will: We will complete targeted operations in the areas concerned and look to offer education and enforcement where required. We will work with partners in enforcement and ensure action is taken where appropriate.

Community Update – Snibstone Discovery Park

Visited Snibstone Discovery Park and spent time speaking with the park rangers. It really is a fantastic space for the whole community — whether you're bringing children to play safely, walking the dog, cycling, fishing, or simply relaxing and enjoying the local wildlife.

However, it's disappointing that a minority continue to spoil the area for others by taking motor-bikes into the park, which is not permitted and can cause damage and safety concerns.

Great Community Engagement from our Police Cadets

Our fantastic Police Cadets were out supporting the Love Your Neighbourhood Month of Action.

The Cadets carried out a litter pick along Adam Morris Way, Coalville, helping to keep the area tidy and looking its best. They also spoke with local residents, signing people up to our Neighbourhood Link service and listening to any concerns to pass on to the local beat team.



Community Safety Message

We've recently received reports of children and young people entering derelict / abandoned buildings in the area.

These buildings can be extremely dangerous. Risks include unstable structures, broken glass, exposed wiring, hazardous materials, and the potential for sudden collapse. What may seem like harmless exploration can quickly lead to serious injury.

We'd ask parents and guardians to please speak with your children about the dangers and remind them to stay away from these sites.



School Parking and traffic issues, Enforcement continues.

Continuing our beat priority around school parking issues on the Coalville beat, we have teamed up with North West Leicestershire District Council enforcing parking regulations at Belvoirdale, St Clares, All Saints and Broomleys Primary Schools.



Understanding Your Local Beat Teams – North West Leicestershire.

North West Leicestershire Policing area is made up of 5 neighbourhood beat teams, covered by dedicated Neighbourhood Police Officers (PCs) and PCSOs.

New Beat Priorities for July - September

Following feedback from the local community, our new neighbourhood policing priorities for July to September will focus on the following areas:

- **Grieve Close** – Anti-social behaviour, including issues relating to off-road bikes.
- **Adam Morris Way** – Anti-social behaviour and reported drug use.
- **Retail Crime** – Working closely with local retailers to target and reduce shoplifting and associated offences.

We will continue to monitor these concerns closely and take appropriate action. Further updates and information will be shared soon.

Recognise and Report—Protect your home.

As part of our ongoing commitment to keeping our community safe, we would like to share some important crime prevention advice to help protect your home from burglary.

There are a number of simple steps you can take to improve your home security:

- Upgrade patio and rear doors by installing anti-snap locks and secure handles
- Strengthen glass by using security film or installing laminated/limited glass
- Fit additional locks or internal grilles to windows where appropriate
- Use alarms, including window vibration sensors and a full home alarm system, to deter intruders
- Install motion sensor lighting and timer-controlled lamps to increase visibility and remove hiding places
- Keep gardens maintained by trimming bushes and trees, and ensure gates are securely locked

Layering your security by combining these measures can significantly reduce the risk of your home being targeted.
