What matters to you

ASB in the parks and open public spaces in Ashby Town centre during the summer period.

As part of the Government's Safer Summer campaign Leicestershire Police will be using the Safer Summer period to:

- Increase public awareness of visible policing activities, such as patrolling and enforcements, in hotspot areas.
- Highlight engagement efforts with local communities and partners.
- Share effective crime prevention advice and resources focused on ASB, street crime and retail crime.

Car Cruising activity in and around Ashby Town Centre


This continues to be a concern for lots of residents and visitors to the area with reports of cars racing and gathering in car parks.

- We will continue to take action against those who use the roads dangerously and cause ASB in their cars.
- We will work with landowners to design out issues by providing crime prevention support.
- We will educate young drivers in the consequences of their actions.

Tackling Drug Misuse on and around the Meredith & Drew Estate, Ashby.

- Increasing visible police patrols in known hotspot areas to deter illegal activity and provide reassurance to residents.
- Working closely with the community to identify any additional residential areas of concern, ensuring our presence is focused where it's needed most.
- Taking decisive action against those involved in drug-related offences, using all appropriate legal measures to reduce harm and protect our neighbourhoods.

What You Told Us – And What We're Doing

Over the past three months, we've been actively engaging with residents across Ashby to better understand the issues affecting your daily lives. Here's a summary of the key concerns raised and the steps we're taking to address them:

Anti-Social Behaviour at Hood Park

What we heard:

Concerns about drug misuse and violent behaviour, particularly involving young people, in and around Hood Park.

What we did:

Increased patrols and visibility in the area

Working with youth services and local partners to engage with young people.

Targeted enforcement to deter drug-related and violent activity.

Ongoing support for residents who've reported incidents.

Road Safety on Wood Street

What we heard:

Speeding and traffic congestion due to the Money Hill development are causing safety concerns on Wood Street.

What we did:

Launching a road safety initiative focused on speed enforcement.

Monitoring traffic flow and working with local authorities to address congestion.

Engaging with drivers and residents to promote safer road use.

Anti-Social Vehicle Use & Car Cruising

What we heard:

Ongoing issues with car cruising and anti-social driving, especially along the A511 Bypass and around the town centre.

What we did:

Building on previous success with Tesco Ashby to tackle similar issues.

Targeting known hotspots with patrols and enforcement

Taking action against speeding, dangerous driving, and public nuisance offences

Collaborating with partners to explore long-term solutions.

Looking Ahead

Over the next quarter, we'll continue to focus on:

Reducing anti-social behaviour in public spaces

Improving road safety and traffic management

Tackling nuisance vehicle use across Ashby.

Strengthening community engagement and visibility
