You Said	We did
<p><b>ASB incidents such as: Vehicle nuisance or inappropriate use. Rowdy or inconsiderate behaviour. Littering or drugs paraphernalia.</b></p>	<p>Reports of 40+ youths talking about fighting at Wood street park. Risk was assessed as high due to the number of youths involved and the potential for rapid escalation. Police attended likely locations early, providing visible presence to deter gathering and violence. Groups were disrupted and dispersed before a confrontation could take place. Safeguarding actions were prioritised, with particular attention to minors involved. Relevant partners were informed, including neighbourhood teams and youth services, to support follow-up engagement.</p>
<p><b>Concerns relating to Road Safety whether it be parking, speeding or loud cars/bikes a causing nuisance or being ridden in an anti-social manner.</b></p>	<p>See below for full update. Reports of a van driving dangerously on Ashby Road. Area patrols were informed and conducted checks along Ashby Road and surrounding routes. Details were logged for intelligence purposes.</p>
<p><b>Drug dealing on the beat is still a priority.</b></p>	<p>We are always looking for opportunities to gather sufficient intelligence to enforce by way of drugs warrants. Any opportunity to disrupt drug dealing will be grasped by the team and the NPT (Neighbourhood priority team). We continue to welcome any information concerning local drug dealing activities in your area.</p>

## News

Reports came in of anti-social behaviour involving a group of cars on the A47. The vehicles later headed towards LFE, where we intercepted them and stopped two for their manner of driving. Police checks showed both drivers were known to police, and one was breaching a curfew by being out at that time. A report has been submitted to partner agencies regarding the breach, and intelligence has been passed to one of our proactive teams regarding the other driver.

Officers from the Earl Shilton & Barwell, Burbage and Hinckley Beat Teams recently worked alongside Roads Policing Unit (RPU) and Response officers to carry out a proactive traffic operation across Earl Shilton, Barwell, Hinckley and Burbage. The operation focused on keeping our roads safe and addressing offences that put other road users at risk. Results from the day included: 3 speeding tickets issued on the A47 Clickers Way, 4 tickets issued for not wearing a seatbelt, 1 ticket issued



for a vehicle displaying a ghost plate and having no MOT, 1 vehicle issued with a prohibition notice due to an insecure load posing a danger to others, stop searches conducted under s23 Misuse of Drugs Act (no items found), offences identified including no MOT and no rear registration plate and Intelligence submitted relating to a vehicle linked to an outstanding suspect. Road safety is everyone's responsibility. Whether it's speeding, not wearing a seatbelt, or using unsafe vehicles, these offences can have serious consequences. We will continue to carry out enforcement and engagement activity across the area to keep our communities safe.

We attended individuals jumping on roofs and causing ASB on the beat, involving individuals accessing a roof. We spoke with those involved and advised them of the dangers and nuisance caused, issuing verbal warnings regarding antisocial behaviour. We conducted high visibility patrols in the area at peak times to deter further behaviour. We then engaged with residents to reassure them and encourage prompt reporting of repeat incidents. The youths details were obtained and parents/guardians were informed where appropriate and early intervention advice was given.
