There are 2 Primary schools on the area and the team work regularly across the 2 schools ensuring the safety/wellbeing of the students who attend. Talks are regularly given with advice and prevention being offered at any opportunity. The team is a strong team with excellent leadership and a wealth of experience and the team are keen to listen to any concerns that residents have and look to resolving issues and concerns promptly and effectively.

The beat team have been working with partner agencies such as the city wardens with complaints from residents in regards to inconsiderate parking and cars not having any tax or mot, we did a walk around with the city wardens in identifying some of these vehicles and managed to seize a car due to having no tax on it.
