## **NEWS**

There have been 68 incidents across Countesthorpe, Kilby and Foston since beginning of March 2023

Some incidents of notes are:

Suspicious vehicle/person: 5

Domestic incidents: 3

Assaults: 5

The beat team have been dealing with the spike in burglaries in the area conducting CCTV and H2H enquires to establish ID or vehicles that may be involved.

All above incidents are being dealt with or have been dealt with by our response officers or the local beat team

#### The following tips can prevent you becoming a target:

- Be pro-active by having good window locks and strong deadlocks on doors and locks on garden sheds.
- Always lock doors behind you and remove the key from the lock. Hide keys away from doors along with other valuables including handbags, car keys and cash.
- Consider investing in light timers which are inexpensive, widely accessible and give the impression someone is home. You can buy light timers at most DIY stores and ensure they are set for the hours you will be out during the evening.
- If you're going on holiday or away for a long period of time, avoid posting about being away on social media and tell a trusted neighbour how long you will be away for
- And, always ask yourself: Is it locked up? Is it lit up? Is it secure?

• The Darker Nights campaign also focuses on business theft too with most store break-ins occurring at night as the darker evenings provide burglars with more opportunity to break into businesses.

#### You Said - Anti-Social Behaviour

**We Did** – In the last month there have been no reports involving drugs in the area. We will continue monitoring and gathering any intelligence that is reported to us.

#### You Said - Road Safety

We Did – Last month concerns re speeding was raised again to us by the community of Kilby, this is being monitored and our local road policing team and volunteers are also aware. There were also reports of abandoned vehicles and RTC'S following speeding vehicles or road conditions, the beat team are dealing with enquires and concerns raised in regards to these incidents.
