What Matters to you?

There has been an increase of attempt thefts of expensive vehicles in the area where thieves are using a scanning device which duplicates the signal from the key for the vehicle. This is then used to open the vehicle and drive it away. We have got some stock of the IRFID pouches which once the key is placed inside it will block the signal. This effects key-less entry vehicles only!



We have also had a few number plates being stolen from vehicles we have stock of some anti-theft numberplate screws both items can be collected from Spinney Hill Police Station, stocks are limited for the pouches.



What we are doing

- **Patrols around the Leicester General Hospital** as there has been a few thefts and burglaries in the location
- **Continuing patrols around Falmouth Road**, and the illegal car trading which has been occurring. The council has been involved also with solving this issue.
- **We have been assisting officers with the large scale Radio 2 event** on the park where approximately 70.000 people attended, it was a great event and went smoothly and the weather was amazing

Ways on reporting incidents to the police have changed!

Due to the emergency 999 number being inundated with calls and also the 101 service Leicestershire police have introduced another way of reporting to tackle the demand. There is a new initiative which has been introduced called "Click before you call"

This is a simple method to save you from waiting on the phone and allows you to input as much information on the online form as possible.

We have had a increasing amount of demand on the 999 service where people are calling the police on the 9's and at times the call is not deemed as an emergency. We need to keep this line clear to assist anyone who does require
