What matters to you

- **Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)** – Residents continue to report concerns around nuisance behaviour in parks, alleyways and near local shops. We are focusing on groups gathering late into the evening and noise related ASB.
- **Vehicle related ASB** – Reports have increased regarding e-bikes and motorbikes being ridden without care, particularly around residential streets and footpaths. This remains a priority due to the safety risks involved.
- **Road Safety**—You have told us that Road Safety is a priority, this includes things like Speeding, Insurance, MOT and driving offences.

What have we done **#yousaidwedid**

- **ASB Patrols** – Officers have completed targeted patrols across July in hotspot areas including Frolesworth Road Park, the industrial estate, and nearby housing areas. Individuals have been spoken to regarding behaviour causing alarm or distress.
- **E-bike & Motorbike Enforcement** – Patrols have been increased around key junctions where incidents have been most frequent. Section 59 warnings will be issued to offenders.
- **Road Safety**—the local beat team regularly conduct speed checks and deal with any traffic issues that are reported on the beat. We endeavour to update via social media or Neighbourhood Link when we complete these duties.

What have we done #yousaidwedid

ASB Patrols:

Throughout July, the beat team have carried out regular patrols across key locations raised by the community. Officers have checked local parks, spoken with businesses, and monitored areas where concerns have been highlighted.

Areas such as Frolesworth Road Park, the Swannington Road industrial estate and the Spar shop on the Devitt Way estate have all received increased attention. These patrols aim to deter anti social behaviour and identify individuals responsible for causing disruption.



Issues regarding ASB E-bikes & Motorbikes:

We have continued to respond to reports of scrambler bikes and e-bikes being ridden without care, creating noise and safety issues for residents and families using local parks.

Officers are issuing Section 59 warnings where riders use bikes in a dangerous or anti-social manner, ensuring appropriate action can be taken.

Patrols have been focused on areas where incidents are most common. If you witness bikes being ridden illegally or causing noise related ASB, please report it so we can continue to take action.

Vehicle Crime Prevention - July 2026

During July, we received reports of attempted car key burglaries and one car key burglary within the area. These incidents serve as a reminder that vehicle thieves often target homes in order to gain access to vehicle keys, particularly for newer vehicles with keyless entry systems.

- There are several simple steps residents can take to help reduce the risk of becoming a victim:
- Store vehicle keys away from doors, windows and letterboxes.
- Keep keyless entry fobs in a Faraday pouch when not in use to block the signal.
- Consider using a steering wheel lock or other visible security device as an additional deterrent.
- Park in a well-lit location, preferably on a driveway or somewhere overlooked by your property.
- Ensure all vehicle doors and windows are secured, even when parked at home.
- If your vehicle has a tracking system or security app, check that it is active and functioning correctly.
- Report any suspicious activity around vehicles or residential properties to the police.

Visible security measures can make a significant difference and may be enough to encourage offenders to move on. By taking a few preventative steps, residents can help protect both their vehicles and their homes from opportunist criminals.
