We have listened to you and the concerns you raised and will priorities the

following from March 2025.

Priority 1: ASB. **You said**: You have concerns around antisocial behavior across the village. We will continue to try and disrupt this type of behavior and use the ASB incremental approach to deter offenders.

Priority 2: Speeding. You said: You are concerned about vehicles speeding in the villages. We will continue to monitor and enforce speed across several sites in the village.

Priority 3: Burglaries. We aim to work with the relevant authorities to reduce the burglaries across the village and to try and reduce the number of reported thefts from the recycling centre. Visiting victims and offering crime prevention advice.

Priority 1: The beat team aim to tackle different elements of ASB in Mountsorrel

During the month of June. We had some reports of ASB on Gilliver Drive earlier in the month. All have been identified and will be receiving a visit from the team. High visibility patrols have continued throughout the month around the village. Within the last monthly newsletter I informed you that there was an emerging issue of motorbikes being ridden around the village in an anti-social manner. We had one further report this month. The ridder was very swiftly identified by the team and received a visit to advise him of his future ridding. Please report any ASB via online or 101

Priority 2: The beat team aim to target reports of speeding in Mountsorrel.

Speed Ops

We completed speed checks on Tuesday 12th June 2025 on West Cross Lane within the village. We were at the location for thirty minutes during the evening rush hour. Seventy eight cars came passed us during a thirty minute period. Sixty seven cars were under the speed limit with eleven being over. We gave one verbal advice. Please continue to tell us of locations around the village of where you believe speeding is an issue and we will add the location to the list.

Priority 3: Burglaries

Burglary patrols are happening daily. Local beat officers and response officers across Charnwood NPA at all times of the day and night in marked police vehicles to deter the burglaries from happening. I have not had any reported burglaries for the past month. If you would like any further crime prevention advice please go to our website. We also have some Police Support Volunteers at Loughborough who complete home visits to offer crime prevention advice. If you would like a visit please get in touch. We also continue to visit victims of crime and burglary to offer further advice.
